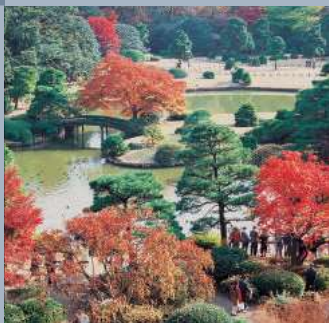

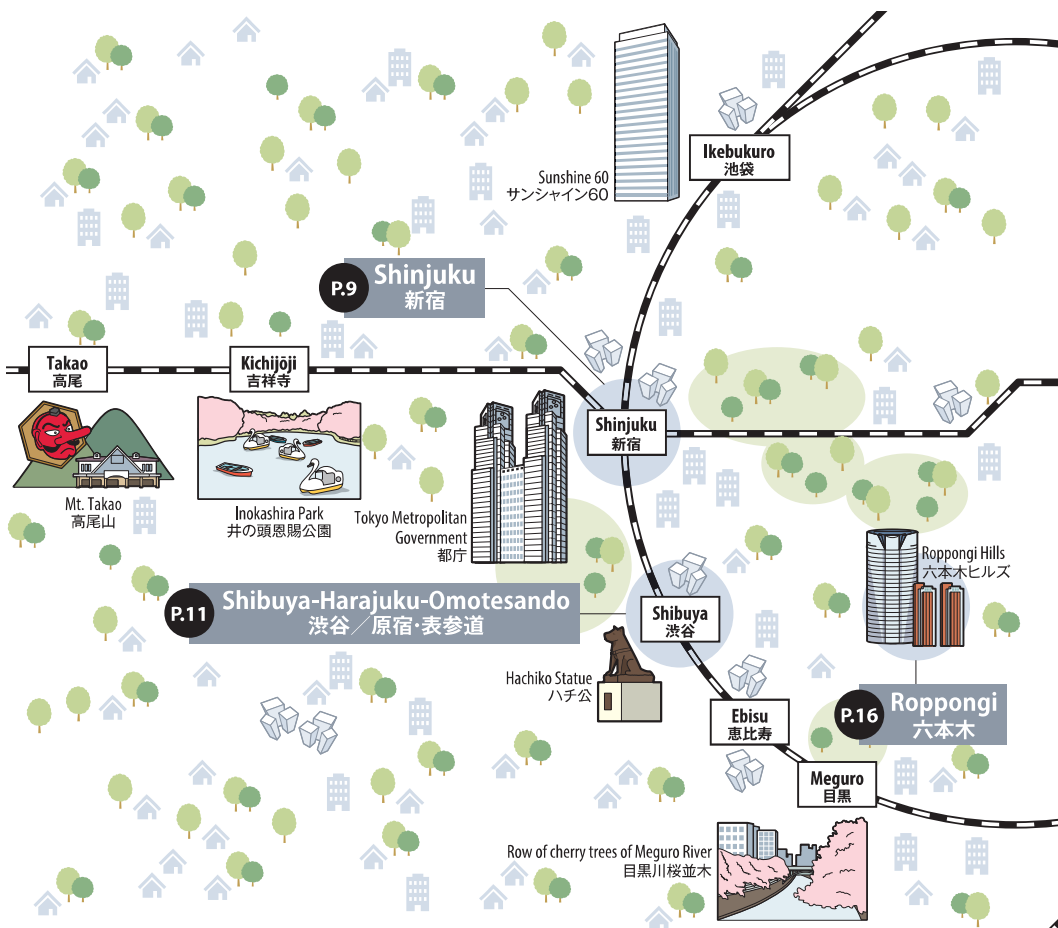

Tokyo at a Glance Map & Major Modes of Transport

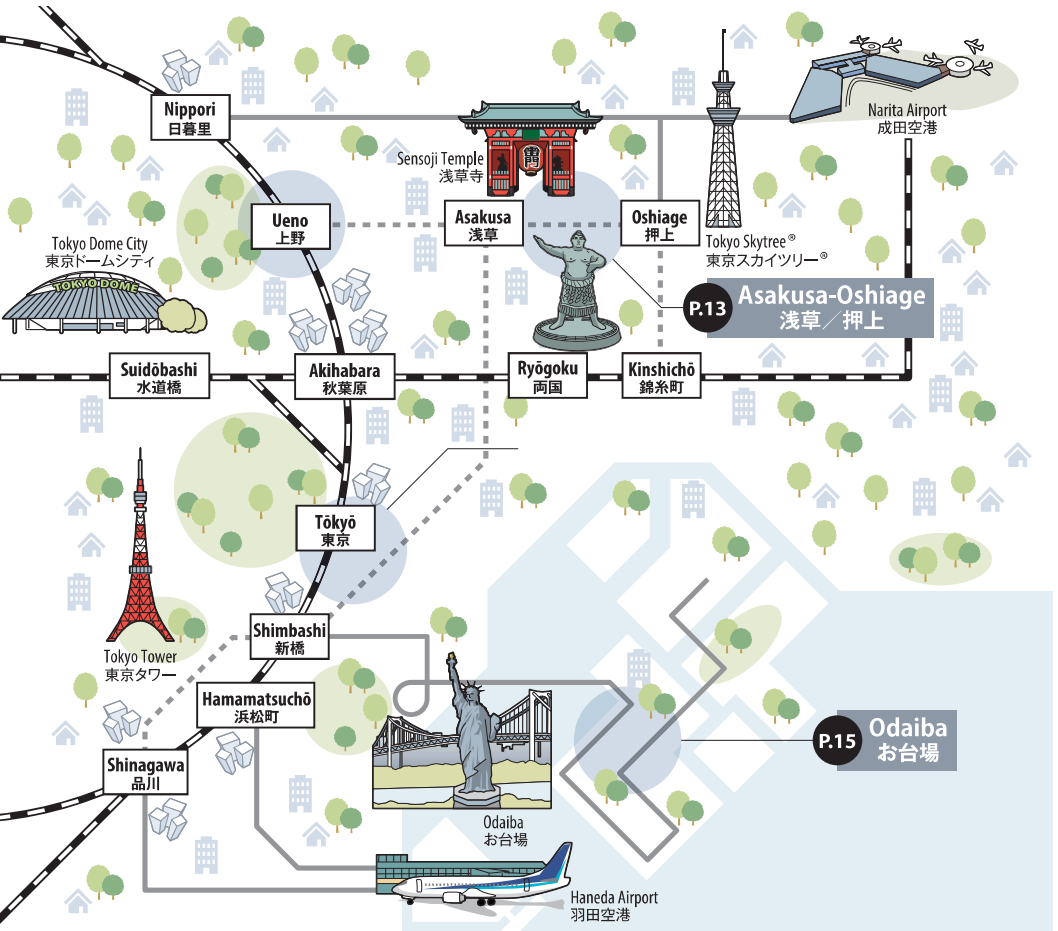


Handy Smart Cards



SUICA and PASMO reusable smart travel cards (deposit ¥500) can be topped up at station ticket machines and are convenient if you use trains frequently, as you don't have to buy a ticket each time you travel. They can also be used to make small purchases at station kiosks, convenience stores and other shops. The cards are available from ticket machines and counters in stations.

Tokyo has an extensive public transport network, and skilful use of trains and buses is the key to getting around the city efficiently. Combining them with taxis will allow you to see the sights in comfort. For a handy transportation app, go to www.navitime.co.jp/pcstorage/html/japan_travel/english/.



Buses



Regular bus routes serve every area of Tokyo. If your destination is some distance from the nearest train station, or the journey is complicated, buses can be a convenient way to get exactly where you want to go. You can also use SUICA and PASMO travel cards on buses.

Taxis



Taxis are a more expensive way to travel than trains and buses, but are convenient if you want to move around efficiently. Most taxi drivers do not speak foreign languages, so it's a good idea to write down your destination and show it to the driver, then all you have to do is pay the fare shown on the meter when you reach your destination.

Basic Tips

Wi-Fi and money in Japan are a little different from other countries. Getting that information beforehand will help avoid problems during your trip.

Money

Credit cards are convenient for shopping, but please note that some cards can't be used at some shops. And sometimes you can't use a credit card with vending machines, taxis, at lunch (period), in ramen shops, or at the station to buy tickets, for example. So, carrying an amount of cash (Japanese yen) around with you is a good idea, just in case.

Exchange

You don't have much Japanese money left and you need to exchange or withdraw cash during your trip. No problem! There are lots of places in Tokyo where you can change your money or use your overseas credit card at an ATM.



Seven Bank

Easy to use ATMs. Insert your card then select your language on the screen. You can withdraw up to ¥100,000 at a time.

Japan has different rules to other countries, so enjoy your trip by observing Japanese rules and manners. And bring the right clothes for the season, so the heat or cold doesn't cause you any trouble.

Weather

Jan.-Mar.



Cold, so you'll need a thick coat or a down jacket. Scarf, gloves and boots would be very handy.

Apr.-Jun.



Gradually getting warmer, so a jacket and light coat would be fine. A shawl would be handy for ladies.

Jul.-Sep.



Dress for the heat in cool clothes. A parasol or hat would be handy for the strong sunshine.

Oct.-Dec.



You'll need a cardigan or jacket. The temperature can drop suddenly, so take care.

Shopping



The prices on price tags may include consumption tax or not depending on the store, so check at the counter. If you want to try putting on something you like, ask a shop assistant first.

Onsen (hot springs)



In Japan, the rule is that onsen baths are enjoyed naked, without swimwear. You must keep your towel out of the bath, and use plenty of water to rinse off any dirt before you get in.

Mobile Phones



It's best not to talk on the phone while you're on a public bus or train, etc. Avoid talking on the phone in a loud voice while in restaurants and cafés. It's better to go outside to talk on the phone.

Let Others Out First



The people getting out of the train, bus or lift, etc. have priority, so wait till they are out before getting in. Getting in while people are still getting out is against the rules and causes trouble for the people on the spot, so take care.

Toilets



Be sure to drop any toilet paper you have used into the toilet bowl then flush. The rubbish bins in washrooms are for sanitary napkins, so take care not to put used toilet paper in a rubbish bin. Smoking is not permitted in toilets in Japan.

Meals



It is polite in Japan to hold your bowl or plate and eat from it rather than leaving it on the table. It is considered rude to eat from your bowl or plate without picking it up. At food courts, you should also return your empty dishes after your meal.

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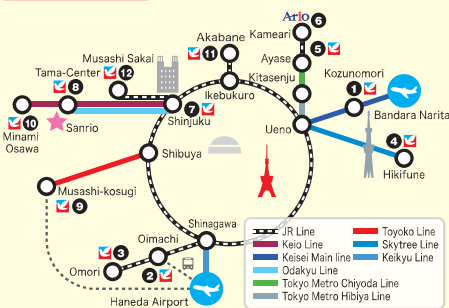
