Ueno Park 上野恩賜公園



Ueno Park, Japan's first public park, was established in 1873. Unique points about the park include the high concentration of modern art and cultural facilities in its lush forest, as well as an abundance of historic monuments and relics dating back to the Edo and early Meiji periods. It also boasts picturesque views of cherry blossoms in the spring.

Kaneiji Temple 東叡山寛永寺



Kaneiji Temple was originally built in 1625 as a family temple of the Tokugawas by the high Buddhist priest Tenkai. Tenkai commanded great respect from Tokugawa Ieyasu, the found of the Tokugawa Shogunate, as well as his successors. The original temple halls were destroyed during the Battle of Ueno in 1868.

Shitamachi Museum 下町風俗資料館



Shitamachi Museum recreates the atmosphere of shitamachi (old downtown Tokyo) and its customs and life style in the Meiji, Taisho, and early Showa periods-from the 1860's to the 1940's. Visitors can enjoy regular demonstrations of handicraft making or take the children to a street "picture-story" show.
