






From Nihonbashi, which was the economical and cultural center during the Edo era, to Ginza. These shopping areas contain shops opened during the Edo era and top luxury brand shops, among others.



Near Nihonbashi, which is the starting point of the Japanese roadway network, there are department stores such as Mitsukoshi, Takashimaya and COREDO Muromachi.

Nihombashi Station → Tokyo Metro Ginza Line (about 3 min.) → Ginza Station



Here, there are many department stores such as Matsuya and Mitsukoshi

as well as Japanese and foreign brand shops, well-established Japanese accessory and sweets shops, and famous shops that masterfully make their products with skills that have been passed down the generations.



Ginza, which was once the main source for Western culture, still retains its historic establishments such as old Western restaurants and cafes. There are also many high-class restaurants and sushi bars here.

Sensoji Temple

This is the oldest temple in Tokyo and the symbol of Asakusa. After

crossing Kaminarimon Gate and walking through Nakamise Street, which is lined with about ninety shops, you will reach the Main Hall, where the statue of the Kannon of compassion is enshrined.

Ever since its opening in 1958, it has been adored as the landmark of Tokyo. The Top Deck is located at a height of 250 meters.



Good spots to visit are the Kokyo Gaien National Garden at the Imperial Palace Plaza, which commands a view of the Double Bridge (Main Gate Stone Bridge), and the East Gardens of the Imperial Palace, where relics such as the keep of the Edo Castle still remain.

There are many restaurants in the commercial buildings on the Marunouchi side such as the Marunouchi Bldg. and the Shin-Marunouchi Bldg. Locations on the Yaesu side such as the Yaesu Underground Shopping Center and Granroof are dotted with shops.




Shibuya-Omotesando-Harajuku

The west side of Shinjuku Station is lined with skyscrapers with restaurants on the upper floors that let you enjoy the night view while dining. The east side of Shinjuku Station is a large entertainment district where famous spots such as Kabukicho and the Shinjuku Golden-Gai are located.




deducted automatically. In addition, fares are usually lower than when purchasing tickets at ticket machines in Tokyo (fares are the same in some cases). The card can also be used as electronic money for shopping at registered shops.







Famed for its annual Tori-no-Ichi market in November, hundreds of thousands of people gather to buy kazari-kumade (decorative rakes), food, and other wares. There are also stalls selling food. The kumade are believed to help in "raking in" wealth and

good fortune.

This was the first post station on the Tokaido road, a major thoroughfare that connected Edo and Kamigata (modern day Tokyo and the Kyoto-Osaka region, respectively). Its significance to travelers back then is still visible, indicated by the large number of shrines and temples along the way. Shinagawa-iinia Shrine sits on a small hill and boasts a miniature Mt. Fuii, called Fujizuka. Visitors are welcome to climb this 15-meter high stone structure with steps to take in a view of Shinagawa-shuku. Ebara-jinja Shrine is located alongside the Meguro River and is the only shrine in Tokyo where its mikoshi (portable shrine) is carried into the sea during festivals. This area also features numerous kakigori (shaved ice) shops and cafes, making it a wonderful place for a relaxing stroll.

General Information for Tourists



Climate

There are four distinct seasons. Spring –March to May– and autumn –September to November– are comfortable. However, there are many rainy days (rainy season) from mid-June to July.

In summer, it is hot during the day and humid at night. In winter, there are many clear days but it is often cold and dry.



Currency exchange, changing money

As of November 6, 2019, US\$1=¥109.08 Money can be exchanged at currency exchange counters located mainly at banks, post offices, hotels and airports.



Postal services

Mail can be sent from Japan to abroad at the post office. Postcards and letters can be left at the front desk of your hotel or dropped in a post box on the street or at a tourist site. All postcards cost ¥70. Letters vary from ¥90 to ¥230, depending on the destination.



Smoking

Although smoking is prohibited in most public facilities as a general rule, there are some facilities with smoking areas. Smoking is prohibited when specified in the streets of downtown areas, shops, restaurants, etc.



Currency

The yen (\pm) is the currency of Japan. Bills come in denominations of \pm 10,000, \pm 5,000, \pm 2,000, and \pm 1,000. (Nowadays \pm 2,000 bills are rare.)

Coins come in denominations of ¥500, ¥100, ¥50, ¥10. ¥5 and ¥1.



ATMs that accept overseas credit cards

Credit cards such as VISA, MasterCard, Diners Club, and American Express, as well as cash cards with logos issued by major banks of the world such as PLUS and Cirrus can be used with Japan Post, SEVEN BANK ATMs and AEON BANK located in Japan.

Voltage, power

The voltage in Japan is 100V. The frequency is 50/60Hz. A voltage transformer should be used with electronic items brought over from overseas. The double socket outlet is standard.



Tap water

Since Tokyo has the excellent water supply system, it is safe to drink straight tap water.



Consumption tax

Consumption tax at shops, restaurants, etc. is 10%. Please note whether the tax is included in the indicated price depends on the shop and product. Foods and beverages are subject to the reduced tax rate of 8% in some cases. Visit the following website for more information.

Tax-free system

The requirement for tax exemption is the purchase of general items (electric appliances, clothing, accessories, etc.) worth over 5,000 yen at the same shop on the same day by the same person. For consumable items (food, drinks, medicine, cosmetics, etc.), tax exemption applies for purchases above 5,000 yen but below 500,000 yen at the same shop on the same day by the same person. For combination of general items and consumable items, tax-exemption applies under the same conditions as consumable items. Please see the Japan Tourism Agency website for details.

If there is an earthquake:

Hide under a table to protect yourself from falling objects until the shaking stops instead of rushing outside the building. Turn on the TV or radio and find out what the situation is.

The "KOBAN" sign indicates a police box. Police boxes are located in crowded places such as train stations and downtown areas. Police officers are ready 24 hours a day to provide assistance.
