Seven Lucky Gods

(Shichifukujin)

Musashi-Itsukaichi Seven Lucky Gods started as an event to welcome seven gods of luck in 2010. Participants visit five temples and two Jizodo in the Akigawa Keikoku Valley area to pray for good fortune. This event is held each year from January 1 to 3 from 9am to 4pm. At Musashi-Itsukaichi Station and each venue, you can get a Seven Lucky Gods memorial page (300 yen), memorial seal imprint (stamp/each venue 200 yen).

What is Shichifukujin-meguri?
Spread as a folk religion towards the end of the Muromachi period, by the mid Edo period shrines to the seven lucky gods had prospered in Tokyo's Yanaka and spread to other places.

1. Benzaiten - Shokoji Temple
2. Daikokuten - Daihiganji Temple
3. Ebisuten - Shitamachi Jizodo
4. Bishamonzen - Bamba Jizodo
5. Fukurokuju - Gyokurinji Temple
6. Hoteison - Kogonji Temple
7. Jurojin - Tokuinjin Temple

The memorial paper and impressions are available until the end of January.

Route from Musashi-Itsukaichi Station by bus



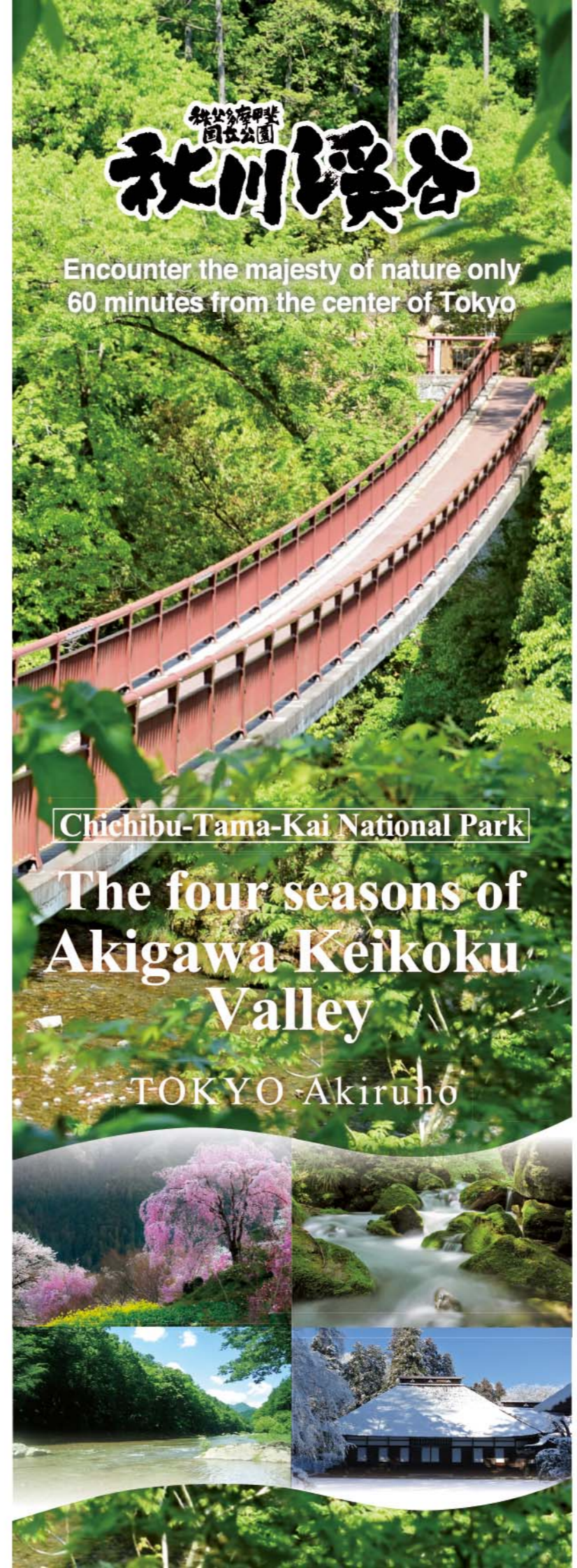

- Mid Aug ★ Kowada Fireworks Festival / Lantern Floating * Kowada Area
- Last Saturday of Aug ★ Yoruichi (Night Market) * Hinohara Road (from Musashi-Itsukaichi Station to Konakano)

Three Major Festivals of Akiruno (Regular Festival)

These are the three major regular shrine festivals in Akiruno City. The Ninomiya-jinja Shrine festival involves offerings of ginger to the shrine. Shoichi Iwabashiri-jinja Shrine's festival includes a parade through the town with many portable shrines and floats. Akiru-jinja Shrine's festival features more than about 400kg hexagonal portable shrines.

Akigawa Keikoku Valley

Encompassing the emotions of the seasons

Akigawa is the largest tributary of the Tama river flowing through the capital region. The region along the 20 kilometers stretching from Akiruno City to Hinohara Village is called the Akigawa Keikoku Valley. The forests of the Chichibu-Tama-Kai National Park expand from the area of Akiruno City, changing appearance with each season and giving many opportunities to experience the awe of nature's wonders.

1 Otaki Falls
The beautiful Otaki Falls along the hiking trail to Mt. Otake have a 30m drop. The Kotaki Falls have a lower flow but fill out in splendor after a rain.



3 Ishibunebashi Bridge
This pedestrian suspension bridge joins the Jurigi Bus Stop on the Hinohara road to the Akigawa Keikoku Seoto-no-Yu Spa. The bridge offers an imposing view of the valley from 96m above.



5 Akiruno Furusato Kobo Workshop
Enjoy one of Tokyo intangible cultural properties, "Gundogami" paper making through crafting experiences and sales.



6 Akigawa Keikoku Seoto-no-Yu Spa
The highly alkaline spring attracts many repeat visitors seeking beautiful skin and you can enjoy a full day at the Japanese cuisine restaurants and cottages available for use as lodging facilities on the grounds.

9 Otake Limestone Cave
Enter a mysterious world of limestone beauty. Otake Limestone Cave is a Metropolitan Natural Monument and stretches 300m while Mitsugo Limestone Cave features vertical drops in three stages.

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4 Otsu Hana-no-Sato Flower Garden
From early to mid-April, surround yourself with weeping cherries and rhododendrons.



2 Akigawa International Trout Fishing Ground
Rentals are available for rods, bait and barbecue sets so you can come without bringing any extra equipment.



7 Tokura Shiroyama Terrace
These tourist accommodations use a closed elementary school.



12 Yamadaki no Okashi (Great Oak of Fukasawa)
(60 minutes walk from JR Musashi Itsukaichi Station)
This large Japanese oak is said to be more than three hundred years old. The broad branches reach to the sky and powerful roots stretch over a large limestone base. This extraordinary specimen of life is worth the view.



11 Konpira Park
With a view point that allows a majestic view of Akiruno City in the park, it is popular for the gentle hiking trail.

13 Minamisawa Ajsaiyama (Hydrangea Woods)
About 10,000 hydrangeas bloom with vibrant myriad colors of pink and blue stretching along a half-kilometer of this forest path. Best enjoyed from June to early July.

14 Kotokuji Temple (30 minutes walk from JR Musashi Itsukaichi Station)
Passing the massive mountain gate reveals two large ginkgo trees with leaves that glow a golden yellow every year in mid November.

15 Akigawa Keikoku Valley Tourism Information Corner
Discover Akigawa Keikoku Valley's best sightseeing locations and current events at this facility just outside JR Musashi Itsukaichi Station's wicket.

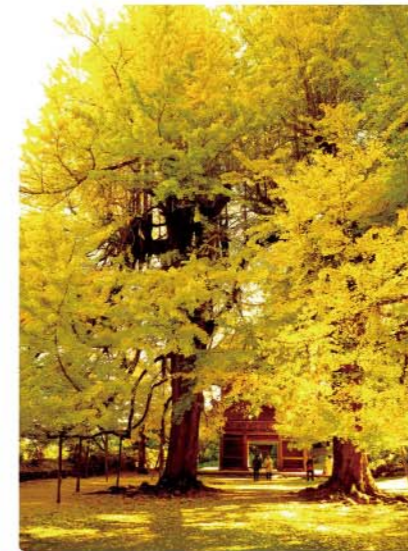
16 Mt. Bentenyama
Mt. Bentenyama rises 300m above sea level and is home to cherry blossoms and rhododendrons, affording a panoramic view from the peak of the Akiru Plains.

19 Kogonji Temple
The large cherry tree is a Metropolitan Designated Natural Memorial and reaches full bloom from mid to late April bringing joy to all who see it.

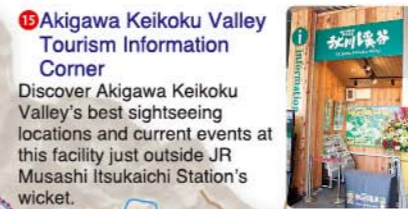
20 Komine Park
Komine Park is famed for its cherry blossoms and idyllic rice paddies and streams. There are many experiences for you to participate in.



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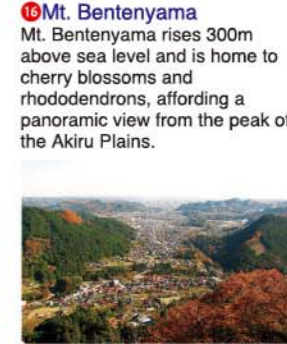
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
