

## Opening of a new commercial facility "HIBIYA OKUROJI" underneath the elevated railway tracks in September

The facility is located in a 300-meter long space under the elevated railway tracks between Yurakucho and Shimbashi stations. The railway tracks have a characteristic brick arch design made in 1910. There will be various kinds of restaurants serving Japanese, German, and Spanish dishes, various styles of bars, and shops selling collectibles made by artisans.

## Takanawa Gateway Station Opened on March 14

The new station opened between Tamachi and Shinagawa stations on the JR Yamanote and Keihin-Tohoku lines. The design architect is Kengo Kuma, the world-famous architect. The design includes "wa" Japanese atmosphere, with a large roof made in the *origami* style (the art of paper folding). Inside the station, robots and station service equipment featuring the latest technologies are experimentally implemented, along with a permanent installation of an unmanned convenience store operated by Al.
