Bunkyo City is home to a number of unique museums and many gardens rich in green. Why not take a walk, map in hand, to appreciate the historical sites, art, and nature? The map is organized by area and highlights recommended facilities and relevant information.

## Koishikawa Area

- 10 Koishikawa Annex, The University Museum, The University of Tokyo. The Museum of Architecture within the oldest school building of the University of Tokyo.
  - 37 Botanical Gardens, Graduate School of Science, The University of Tokyo. 4,000 different species of plants and trees are preserved in their natural forms.
- Nearest station ▶ Myogadani Sta. (M23, Marunouchi Line)  
▶ Hakusan Sta. (I13, Mita Line)

## Honkomagome Area

- 13 Inoue Enryo Memorial Museum, Toyo University. Toyo University's historical materials and art objects are on display.
  - 14 Toyo Bunko Museum. Let's take a picture in 'The Morrison's Stacks' containing 24,000 volumes!
  - 35 Rikugien Gardens. Enjoy seasonal flowers such as cherry blossoms, azaleas, and autumn leaves as well as the change of the landscape throughout the year.

## Nezu / Sendagi Area

- 25 Takehisa Yumeji Museum. This museum has a collection of 3,300 works by Yumeji Takehisa.
  - 28 Yayoi Museum. This museum exhibits the artworks of Kashi Takabatake, an illustrator representing the beginning of the Showa era. In addition, the unique temporary exhibitions are very popular.
  - 17 Insect Museum of J.H.Fabre. You can see insects super magnified with a unique tool 'Mushi Mega Ne-Kun'.
  - 18 Mori Ogai Memorial Museum. The permanent exhibition offers an insight on the life of Ogai and is a great source of learning for students.
  - 24 Sentaro Iwata Collection Kindonichikan Museum. We preserve almost 800 works of Sentaro, the last successor of Edo Ukiyo-e Bijin-ga.
  - 30 The Former Kusuo Yasuda House and Garden. Volunteers will guide you around the premises. (Contact us for details)

## Yushima/Hongo Area I

- 5 National Archives of Modern Architecture, Agency for Cultural Affairs. Artistic drawings and sketches by famous architects are a must-see.
  - 20 The Mitsubishi Archives. You can watch the video 'The History of Mitsubishi' at the lobby.
  - 23 Kyu-Iwasaki-tei Gardens. Videos showing the history and main attractions are screened from time to time at the video theater in the Western-style building.
- Nearest station ▶ Yushima Sta. (C13, Chiyoda Line)
- 8 Museum of Health and Medicine, The University of Tokyo. A museum introducing the latest research of medical science and health care at the University of Tokyo.
  - 9 The University Museum, The University of Tokyo. You can enjoy intellectual experiences through a numerous collection of academic specimens.
  - 19 Bunkyo Museum. Enjoy learning about the history and culture of the Bunkyo city through actual and visual materials.
  - 22 The Museum Wadatsuminokoe. The exhibit includes visual materials and documentary films that are available for viewing in the audiovisual corner.
- Nearest station ▶ Hongo-sanchoe Sta. (M21, Marunouchi Line)  
▶ Todaimae Sta. (N12, Namboku Line) ▶ Hongo-sanchoe Sta. (E08, Oedo Line)

## Yushima/Hongo Area II

- 3 International Origami Center. You can see a craftsman handyeing 'Washi' (Japanese paper) in the studio.
  - 7 Yushima-Seido. You can feel the spirit of 'Edo' surrounded by a lush green in the center of Tokyo.
  - 11 Tokyo Waterworks Historical Museum. Free entry and audio guides. We also offer guided tours (For groups of at least 5 people/advance reservations required)
  - 12 Toyo Gakuen Archives, Toyo Gakuen University. The tile mural Phoenix Mosaic facing Iki-zaka by Architect Kenji Imai.
  - 15 Japan Football Museum. Explore the history of Japanese football over the century and 2002 FIFA World Cup.
  - 26 Tokyo Arts and Space Hongo. Art space building was originally built in 1928 to be used as an employment agency.
- Nearest station ▶ Hongo-sanchoe Sta., Ochanomizu Sta. (M21, M20, Marunouchi Line) ▶ Suidobashi Sta. (I11, Mita Line) ▶ Hongo-sanchoe Sta. (E08, Oedo Line) ▶ JR Ochanomizu Sta., Suidobashi Sta.

## Edogawa-bashi/Gokokuji Area

- 1 Printing Museum, Tokyo. At the printing workshop 'Printing House', you can experience the technique of letterpress printing with metal movable types.
  - 16 Japan Women's University Naruse Memorial Hall. You will get information about Japan's first women's university in this memorial hall.
  - 23 Eisei Bunko Museum. The museum has about 94,000 art and historical works, including 8 national treasures and 34 important cultural properties. The building is also a must-see.
  - 33 Hatoyama Hall. Enjoy cherry blossoms and gorgeous roses in the spring, and fragrant roses and fall colors in the fall.
  - 34 Higo-Hosokawa Garden. In the lush green Japanese garden, the maple leaves turn a beautiful red from late November.
- Nearest station ▶ Edogawabashi Sta., Gokokuji Sta. (Y12, Y11, Yurakucho Line)

## Kasuga / Korakuen Area

- 2 TeNQ Space Museum. Space Store (a museum store offers space-themed gifts) is also open. The store is available for both museum visitors and non-visitors.
  - 4 Gallery AaMo. We hold events of various genres that change every 1 to 3 months.
  - 5 Kodokan Judo Museum & Library. Learn about Judo history at the museum, then go up to the top floor and watch Judo practice in a grand Dojo, 500 tatami mats in size.
  - 21 The Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum. Right of Tokyo Dome Gate 21. The museum also has video theaters and libraries.
  - 27 Japan-China Friendship Center Museum. In organized exhibitions, various events such as production demonstrations and workshops, are planned.
  - 31 Koishikawa Korakuen Gardens. This garden is a 'National treasure' having a double designation as a special historic site and a special scenic spot.

## Bunkyo City X Chihayafuru

'Chihayafuru' (BE-LOVE magazine published by Kodansha) is a popular Japanese manga series written and illustrated by Yuki Suetsumu. The story is about Kyogi-Karuta (a competitive game using 'Ogura Hyakunin-Isshu' Karuta cards). Since Bunkyo City is the birthplace of Kyogi-karuta, there are facilities that appeared in the manga series and has a strong connection with the game. The illustration on the cover of this map was specially drawn by the artist Suetsumu; it depicts a scene in which the three characters are visiting Bunkyo City. Enjoy the 'Bunkyo City X Chihayafuru' collaboration, including the B-GURU bus and one-day passes decorated with 'Chihayafuru' illustrations.
