- O From Tokyo, Take the Chuo Line rapid service train to Ome, or from Chuo Line Tachikawa Station Chiba areas to Ome Line Kabe or Higashi Ome Stations
- O From Omiya, Urawa areas Wusashino Line Nishi Kokubunnji Station to Chuo Line Tachikawa Station, Urawa areas then to Ome Line Kabe or Higashi Ome Stations
- O From Yokohama, Yokohama Line Hachioji Station to Hachiko Line Haijima Station, Machida areas then to Ome Line Kabe or Higashi Ome Stations

(B) Shinmei-sha Shrine

Although the founded vear is unknown, it was known as Shinmei Daijingu Shrine in the ancient times.
