Touring for flowers in Ome

Ome is colored with flowers of the four seasons. Enjoy the colorful sights of the perfectly named "Flower Corridor"!

1 Shiofune Kannon-ji Temple

The temple is commonly known as "the temple of flowers and history", and the precinct, filled with historical remnants, is adorned with a variety of seasonal flowers.

Recommended Events

Azalea Festival

The festival is held annually from mid-April to early May. Approximately 17 thousand azalea flowers will be in full bloom.

Entrance fee Adult : 300 yen
Only during the festival. Child : 100 yen

Hiwatari Aragyo on May 3rd (Literally, hard training of walking over the fire!)

Recommended Sites

Shiofune Heiwa Kannon Statue

The view from the Heiwa Kannon statue, located at the top of the azalea garden, is superb.

The Great Cedar Trees of Shiofune Kannon

The cedar trees, known as the "married couple cedar", are designated as a metropolitan natural monument.



3 Kasumi-kyuryo Natural Park

The park is the starting point of the Kasumi-Kyuryo Hills Hiking Trail, and is located to the north of Shiofune Kannon-ji Temple.

4 Rissho Kosei-kai's Cherry Trees Promenade

The part of Kasumi-Kyuryo Hills Hiking Trail presents a magnificent view of the cherry blossoms in spring.

*Due to being located within the premises of the facility, open for walking from 8 AM to 5 PM.

5 Oido Park Peony Garden

A wide variety of colorful peonies flower in season. "The great well of Ome Shinmachi", located in the park, is a designated historical site of Tokyo.

Flowering season Late April to early May (no entrance fee)
Open hours 8 AM to 6 PM
*Only during blooming season.

6 Fukiage Iris Park

Fukiage Iris Flower Festival is held in season, and over 200 varieties of iris will be in full bloom.

Closed on Wednesdays (Closed entirely from Dec. to Feb.)
Open hours 9 AM to 5 PM

Recommended Events

Fukiage Iris Festival

Held during Late May to late June
*Schedule is subject to change depending on the season.
Open hours 9 AM to 5 PM (Open everyday during the festival)
Entrance fee 200 yen, during the time of the festival only. (Elementary school children and younger are free.)



18 Kasumi-gawa River Walking Course

It is a 5.6 km-long pedestrian walkway along the Kasumi-gawa River. The flat course offers a safe walk while enjoying the view of the river.

19 Kasumi-kyuryo Hills Hiking Trail

The course is approximately 6 kms long and takes about 2 hours on foot. The relatively gentle course is good for the hiking beginners.

20 Kabokuen Park

Surrounded by the abundant nature, the garden houses equipment such as the 211 meters-long roller slide, and is enjoyable for everyone from children to adults.

Access by Train

- From Tokyo, Chiba areas** Take the Chuo Line rapid service train to Ome, or from Chuo Line Tachikawa Station to Ome Line Kabe or Higashi Ome Stations
- From Omiya, Urawa areas** Musashino Line Nishi Kokubunji Station to Chuo Line Tachikawa Station, then to Ome Line Kabe or Higashi Ome Stations
- From Yokohama, Machida areas** Yokohama Line Hachioji Station to Hachiko Line Haijima Station, then to Ome Line Kabe or Higashi Ome Stations



2 Yakuo-ji Temple

The temple is known for the best viewing spot for seasonal flowers especially gorgeous azaleas, as well as the beauty of hydrangeas in the early summer.

Anraku-ji Temple

The principle image of the temple is exhibited only once a year. It is beautiful in spring when the peach and cherry blossoms bloom, coloring the surrounds pink.

TEMPLES & SHRINES HISTORY & ANCIENT TEMPLES

7 Katsunuma-jo Castle Ruins

The ruins of Katsunuma-jo Castle, once the residence of the Mita family, the feudal lords of Ome and surrounds remain, exhibiting historical heritage and nature as one.

Take a tour around spots that mark the passage of time, and discover numerous cultural properties in which the history of Ome is still alive.

11 Tennei-ji Temple

The building arrangement known as "seven-hall temple", with hills in the background, is well-maintained in original condition and is a designated historical site of Tokyo.

22 Iwakura Onsen Village

The village, with golf courses nearby, offers a variety of accommodation available for daytime-use and meals. The best time to see the fireflies along the Nariki-gawa River is late-June to early-July.

Autumn foliage also recommended

23 Kabe Onsen Umenoyu

Directly connected to JR Kabe Station, it is the best place to stop by after sightseeing.

Open hours 10 AM to 11:30 PM (Last entrance at 11 PM)
Basic fee General fee for adults : 860 yen (membership discount available)
Regular Day-Offs Third Wednesday of the month (No closing days during Jan. Feb. Aug. and Dec.)

History & Tradition of Ome

Ome was formerly home to a bustling community of almost 800 weavers and fabric dyers. During the Edo period, the city actively turned out heaps of indigo dyed goods, the color of which was most-loved by the Japanese and soon to become a symbol of Japanese tradition and spirit; the city is also home to Ome-jima stripes, a type of woven fabric which boomed in popularity among urbane Edoites. Ome, a town that developed fabrics, sake, temples, shrines, arts and food culture amidst plentiful nature. Just like the indigo fabrics which grow deeper and darker with each dyeing, a tale of "Ome Blue" is woven here from culture, history, and tradition.

Recommended Sites

8 Komyo-ji Temple

The temple was founded in 1534, as a branch temple of Tennei-ji Temple.

9 Morooka-jinja Shrine

A chinquapin tree, a municipal natural monument, grows to the side of the front hall.

10 Myoko-in Temple

The principle image of the temple, the seated-statue of the Thousand-armed Kannon, is designated as a municipal tangible cultural property.

12 Shinjo-ji Temple

It is believed to have been founded sometime between 1521 and 1527.

13 Shinmei-sha Shrine

Although the founded year is unknown, it was known as Shinmei Daijingu Shrine in the ancient times.

14 Kasuga-jinja Shrine

The main hall was built during the Edo period, and is the Tokyo metropolitan tangible cultural property.

15 Torakashiwa-jinja Shrine

The main hall is designated as Tokyo's tangible cultural property, its precinct as an historical site, and its festive events as an intangible folk cultural asset.

16 Sosen-ji Temple

The Japanese nutmeg tree located within the precinct is designated as a metropolitan natural monument.

17 Former Yoshino Family Residence

This is the residence of the Yoshino family, who cultivated today's Shinmachi area of Ome City, and served as the headman of the village.

Closed on Mondays (the following day if holiday), New Year's holidays
Open hours 10 AM to 5 PM (April to September), 10 AM to 4 PM (October to March)

- Tennei-ji Temple**: 7 min. on foot (450 m)
- Higashi Ome Sta.**: 3 min. on foot (170 m)
