# The Charm of Chiyoda


Chiyoda City is right here!

find Tokyo Station, Yurakucho, Akihabara, Kanda, and more here. Some parts of the city still retain an Edo period atmosphere, while other areas showcase the latest pop culture.

Past and present mingle together here, creating a cityscape full of variety. This ageless city will certainly spark curiosity of those who visit there.

#### Access to Tokyo Station

About 30 minutes from JR Yokohama Station on the Tokaido Main Line. About 40 minutes from

JR Omiya Station on the Utsunomiya Line or Takasaki Line.

About 40 minutes from JR Chiba Station on the Sobu Line rapid train.

About 60 minutes from Narita International Airport on the Narita Express.

About 35 minutes from Haneda Airport on the Tokyo Monorail, transfer at Hamamatsucho Station

#### Access to Akihabara Station

About 45 minutes from Tsukuba Station on the Tsukuba Express, by the fastest train.



#### How to Use this Guide

This guide was created for people who use a wheelchair, cane, stroller, or other means of assistance, so that they can enjoy sightseeing around Chiyoda City without difficulties. Avoiding steps and uneven paths as much as possible, it introduces spots and routes with less barriers. This handy booklet also contains accessibility information around the routes. To navigate through complicated routes, use the free app @AR for assistance. See the page to the right to find out how to use the app. As circumstances vary by person, use this guide to make a travel plan that you find comfortable in your condition.



#### **Tokyo Station Marunouchi** North Exit Dome

Tokyo Station opened in 1914, and its Marunouchi

Building was restored to its original glory in 2012. Eight eagle reliefs and zodiac sign sculptures that adorn the dome's ceiling were reproduced based on original designs.





#### Tokyo Station Gallery

Tokyo Station Gallery opened in the Tokyo Station Marunouchi Building in hopes of making the station a place of culture, instead of a mere transportation hub. Housed in the historic 100-year-old building which has been designated as an Important Cultural Property, this gallery is famous for its brick-walled exhibition rooms.

#### Meiji Seimei Kan



Said to be the finest piece of Classical-style architecture, Meiji Seimei Kan was the first building constructed in the Showa period that has been designated as an Important Cultural Property. Its construction was completed in 1934. Main rooms that remind you of historic events such as the conference room which was used for the Allied Council for Japan meetings after World War II are worth visiting.

#### Wadakura Fountain Park



This park was constructed in 1961 to commemorate the wedding of the Crown Prince at that time. The large fountain was later renovated. Other sculpture fountains found in the park which are lit up at night, creating a fantastic sight are also beautiful. There is a restaurant and free rest area with

open-air seating.

#### The Industry Club of Japan Hall

Established as a businessmen's social club, the hall witnessed dynamic changes in the postwar period. It's one of few architectures in Japan that are built in the authentic Secession style. Though the building was

renovated in 2003, parts of it have been preserved and restored. Please enjoy the building's exterior as it is a membership club.





#### Former Site of Kitamachi Bugyosho

This was the office of Toyama Saemonnojo, a.k.a. Toyama no Kin-san—a famous and wise magistrate of the Edo period—from 1840 to 1843. A monument and restored stone foundation can be found in Marunouchi Trust City and GranTokyo.






#### Mitsuo Aida Museum


#### **Idemitsu Museum of Arts**

#### East Gardens of the Imperial Palace Ote-mon Gate

This gate was the front gate to Edo Castle. Once you enter the Ote-mon Gate, you come into an enclosed square called "masugata," which served to hold back invading enemies. Surrounding white walls have holes called "hazama,"

through which defending soldiers fired guns.

#### Sannomaru Shozokan

(Museum of the Imperial Collections)

The museum owns about 9,800 pieces of invaluable documents, paintings, works of calligraphy, artifacts, and more that have been passed down through generations in the Imperial Household. The Japanese

Government opened it to the public in 1989.





#### Hyakunin-bansho Guardhouse

Over 45 meters long north to south, Hyakunin-bansho was the largest guardhouse in Edo Castle. Four squads of the Teppo Hyakuningumi (a hundred-men firearms troop) took turns guarding the castle. This guardhouse



is called "Hyakuninbansho" because a hundred security guards were stationed here day and night.



# Fujimi-yagura (Mt. Fuji-view Keep)

This turret is also called "Happo-shomen-no-yagura (all-front-facing tower)" because the tower looks the same from all angles and positions. It's a key structure in Edo Castle, and served as the castle keep after the Tenshukaku main tower was lost to fire in 1657.

#### Site of Matsuno-o-roka Corridor

It was in this very corridor that the Matsuno-Roka Attack—a historical incident featured in the movie Chushingura—took place. This grand corridor was lined with sliding doors that were painted with pine trees. It was the second longest corridor in Honmaru palace, at 19 meters long to the west, 31 meters long to the north, and 5 meters wide, forming a "L" shape.





# Tenshudai (Remains of the main tower)

Tenshukaku main tower was once the symbol of shogun's power. After the tower was lost to the great fire in 1657, its base was reconstructed but not the tower itself. A stone wall structure of the main tower remains to this day.







#### Suwano-chaya Tea House

Originally built in the times of 11th shogun Ienari, this tea house was relocated from Fukiage Gardens to its current



location in 1968. The elegant, traditional tea house-style structure is a 1912 reconstruction of the original building. Visitors can enjoy looking at the tea house from outside. From mid-April to June every year, a wonderful view of vivid-colored azaleas and the tea house entertain visitors' eyes.




#### Soto Sakurada-mon Gate

This is where the Sakuradamon Incident—the assassination of Chief Minister Ii Naosuke by ronin samurai of the Mito Domain—took place. As the starting point of the Odawara Kaido trade route, the gate is also called Odawara-guchi. Masugata—a defensive structure against enemy invasion—still remains completely intact at this invaluable gate.

#### **Ushigome Mitsuke** Stone Wall

This stone wall was built when the outer moats of Edo Castle were completed in 1636. Today, you can see parts of the stone wall on both sides of the bridge. It's one of the spots around the remains of the outer moats where you can best get a glimpse of what the castle looked like in the past.





#### Tokyo Daijingu Shrine

& Restrooms

Founded in 1880. This shrine worships the deities that are enshrined at Ise Jingu, and is affectionately called "Oise-sama in Tokyo." It's also known as a shrine that established Shinto wedding rituals. A visit to the shrine will bring you luck in

finding love.

#### Yasukuni-jin ja Shrine



Founded in 1869 on the order of Emperor Meiji, this Shinto shrine is dedicated to those who died in battle from the end of the Edo period until World War II. There is a sample cherry tree that the Japan Meteorological Agency designated for Tokyo. The shrine has also been

a famous spot to see cherry blossoms since ancient times.

#### Yushukan Museum



This museum was built in 1882 as a facility to exhibit ancient armor and other objects in honor of the deities enshrined at Yasukuni-jinia Shrine. Invaluable historical relics are on display, including the deities' wills and portraits, a Mitsubishi A6M Zero fighter, and armor.

#### Bronze Statues of Restrooms Oyama lwao & Shinagawa Yajiro

Ovama Iwao served as Commander-in-Chief of the Japanese Army in the Russo-Japanese War, and the first Minister of Army. Shinagawa Yajiro was a former feudal retainer of the Choshu Domain, and successively held key posts in the Meiji Government. This Kudanzaka Park is small, but packed with many highlights.









#### **National Showa** Memorial Museum

& Restrooms

This museum was built with the purpose of telling the next generations about the hardships the Japanese people, especially the bereaved families, went through. It offers vivid insight into the difficulties of people's lives.

#### Former Site of Bansho Shirabesho

Bansho Shirabesho is a Western studies research institute established by the shogunate government in an urgent effort to introduce Western military technology following Perry's arrival in Japan. After the Meiji Restoration, its name was changed to Daigaku

Nanko (South College of Grand School), and then the school evolved into the University of Tokyo.



#### Tayasu-mon Gate & Kitanomaru National Garden


There's a slope up to 10 degrees at the Tayasu-mon Gate entrance

Tayasu-mon Gate is located at the entrance to Kitanomaru National Garden, Back in the Edo period. the Kitanomaru corner of Edo Castle was home to the residences of Lady Kasuga and other members of the shogun family. Today, the park is home to an art



#### Kanda Myojin Shrine



Former Rensei Junior High School was renovated into a The 1300 year old shrine that symbolizes the atmosphere of cultural complex. This facility has an open gallery, café, shop, Kanda has been revered as the local guardian deity by all and free lounge space. Exhibitions, workshops, and other people of Edo including shoguns, common people, and events are regularly held here. You can spend a relaxing time everyone in between; and it is visited by many worshipers to this day. The stone stairs of Myojin Otokozaka are a great photo spot.

#### Hijiribashi Bridge

This beautiful bridge with magnificent arches was built as part of the reconstruction project following the Great Kanto Earthquake of 1923, and became a new must-see spot in Tokyo at that time. It is made with steel and concrete and measuring 92m long and 22m wide. "Hijiribashi" means

"bridging between two holy sites on both banks."

 The cultural exchange center, EDOCCO, has a café and souvenir shop. It also offers hands-on experiences of traditional culture.





Having miraculously evaded the fires of war, this area retains a retro-like feel. Restaurants that Shotaro Ikenami—author of Onihei Hankacho—frequented appear in the novel series, too. Some of the long-standing restaurants have been designated as a historical structure by the Metropolitan Government. The

buildings are old and not very accessible, but appearances are enjoyable enough. Kanda Yabu Soba is an accessible soba noodle restaurant, and a great spot to eat



#### Meiji University Museum

& Restrooms

With over 90 years of history, this is one of the oldest private museums in Japan. Three museums were integrated into one to form the current museum. About 3,000 pieces of artifacts and documents from the Stone Age to modern times are on permanent display.

#### Otahime Inari-jinja Shrine

In the Muromachi period, Ota Dokan built Edo Castle to deter the advances of the Chiba Clan who had territory on the Boso Peninsula. Displaying an expression of gratitude upon his



daughter's restored health after sickness, he built Otahime Inari-jinja Shrine as a branch shrine of Kyoto's Imoarai Inari-jinja Shrine.



#### Natsume Soseki Monument

Natsume Soseki studied here at Kinka Elementary School (current Municipal Ochanomizu Elementary School). A quote from his first piece of work, I Am a Cat, is carved on the commemorative monu-

#### Jimbocho Used Bookstore **District**

One third of all used bookstores in Tokyo are found here in the Jimbocho area in Kanda, and each bookstore has their own specialized field. Most of the stores are packed to the brim with books, but the staff are often kind enough to make way for you, so feel free to ask.





#### **Book House Cafe**



This is Jimbocho's one and only specialty bookstore that focuses on the latest releases of children's books. It also has a café inside. Complete with a kids' area, people of all ages can enjoy themselves here. The bookstore operates as a book bar at night, and serves alcohol, too.

Designated as a Registered Tangible Cultural Property of Japan in 2003.


