

# Edo period Pre-17th century

Sensoji Temple 🕨 p. 18-1

Though Tokyo is home to prehistoric sites, when speaking of "the oldest of Tokyo," Sensoji Temple will come to many people's mind. Believed to have been built in 628 when Buddhism was first flourishing in Japan, it is known as Tokyo's most ancient temple. The next oldest is Jindaiji Temple, built in 733. In addition, temples and shrines that attracted pilgrims far and wide are still found in many places around Tokyo. In this period Tokyo was not yet Japan's capital, and the region was called "Musashi no Kuni." Still to this day, many places and stations carry the name "Musashi."

# Edo perioo

When Tokugawa leyasu established the shogunate government in Edo (modern-day Tokyo), it sparked two centuries of great development as the eastern hub under the rule of Japan's "bushi" warrior class. In the early 18th century, Edo became the world's largest city at the time with a population of about 1 million. In this period, cherry-blossom viewing at Sumida Park, as well as summer traditions including the Sumida River Fireworks Festival, and the Kanda Shrine Festival (Kanda Matsuri), began to be enjoyed by everyone and have continued to be loved. Arts such as ukiyo-e and Edo cut glass, along with cuisine such as sushi and tempura all, came from this exceptional era.

# Travel

The Meiji Restoration followed the Tokugawa Shogunate, and Japan entered a new era. In 1868, Edo was renamed "Tokyo" and reborn as the nation's capital. The city modernized, adopting Western culture, epitomized in Ginza. The bustling shopping hub with boulevards lined in brick buildings still retains some of the atmosphere of that era. Though the 1923 Great Kanto Earthquake and the ravages of war claimed many structures, others, such as the Tokyo Station building in Marunouchi have been newly restored for today's generation to enjoy.



◆ Start your day from Sensoji Temple, which is said to be the oldest temple in Tokyo. After visiting the temple, walk through busy Asakusa Nakamise Shopping Street to look for souvenirs and try "ningyo-yaki," a popular Tokyo snack. In the morning, the streets are relatively less busy, so you can stroll around at your own pace in a relaxed way. ② As this entertainment district is always at the forefront of trends, it is very popular among young people. Appearing on the huge advertising digital signage in front of Shibuya Station, which was installed in July 2022, the giant 3D digital Akita dog is now attracting lots of attention. ③ This complex facility with 47 floors aboveground opened in November 2019. You can get a panoramic view of Tokyo from the observatory, "SHIBUYA SKX" Stretch out on a hammock, relax, and enjoy watching the sky.

♦ Since its opening in 2020, this complex facility consisting of shops, a hotel, and a park has been popular among people, especially young ones who are conscious of fashion and trends. ♦ Located a bit further out from Shibuya, Omotesando is in a sophisticated setting with numerous luxury brand shops. If you step in the alleys, you can find interesting places, such as chic cafés, variety goods shops, and art museums. Enjoy your stroll freely and comfortably! ♦ The observatory re-opened in 2021 after a renovation, and various events and exhibitions has been held in the exhibition space that is fused with the surrounding scenery. From the roof-top observatory, "Sky Deck," you can enjoy the night view of Tokyo Tower, which looks close enough to touch.

🕠 This area is full of famous ramen restaurants in Tokyo, attracting ramen lovers. The first thing to do on this route is to enjoy ramen! ② Get on "Metrolink Nihonbashi," a free shuttle bus (p.11), at the Yaesu Exit of Tokyo Station. It is not only free but also very convenient and useful for sightseeing in this area. 3 This art museum re-opened in April 2022 after a renovation. Its collection holds about 4,000 pieces of fine art from Japan and Asia. Exhibitions are held under various themes. Ocnsisting of several buildings connected to each other, this complex facility has various types of tenants, such as shops and restaurants, where you can experience Edo culture. There is also a Fukutoku Shrine on the premises. After shopping, take a break at a nice café. S Ningyocho has many old, well-established restaurants specializing in various dishes, such as sukiyaki (a beef hot pot) and oyako-don (a bowl of rice topped with chicken and eggs), throughout the area. End your day with delicious Tokyo dishes!

Enjoy flowers every season at this vast garden, including the renowned Rose Garden in full bloom each autumn, and from spring to early summer. Also, step into the large greenhouse with about 1,300 kinds of plants.

If you rent a bicycle near Chofu Station, it takes about 20 minutes to reach Jindaiji Temple Keep a lookout for interesting shops along the way!





Tucked away between skyscrapers sits a shrine that dates back to the mid-17th century. Famed for its annual Tori-no-Ichi market in November, hundreds of thousands of people gather to buy kazari-kumade (decorative rakes), food, and other wares. There are also stalls selling food. The kumade are believed to help in "raking in" wealth and good fortune.

Tourist Information Center on the 3rd floor and the sophisticated retail plaza "NEWoMan" adjacent, makes it an ideal location for shopping and gathering information before departure or after arrival. Shinjuku Station is surrounded by huge electronics stores such as

Bic Camera, and Yodobashi Camera, which offer plenty of equipment such as PCs and electrical home appliances. With Keio Department Store at the West Exit along with other stores including Shinjuku Isetan at the East Exit and Shinjuku Takashimaya at the South Exit, the area surrounding the station is lined with huge department stores. Among some of the most popular spots are department store basement food floors, which offer food items, Japanese and Western sweets, prepared dishes, boxed lunches, and more. Many popular shops where eager customers are lined up appear one after another.

This was the first post station on the Tokaido road, a major thoroughfare that connected Edo and Kamigata (modern day Tokyo and the Kyoto-Osaka region, respectively). Its significance to travelers back then is still visible, indicated by the large number of shrines and temples along the way. Shinagawa-iinia Shrine sits on a small hill and boasts a miniature Mt. Fuii. called Fujizuka. Visitors are welcome to climb this 15-meter high stone structure with steps to take in a view of Shinagawa-shuku. Ebara-jinja Shrine is located alongside the Meguro River and is the only shrine in Tokyo where its mikoshi (portable shrine) is carried into the sea during festivals. This area also features numerous kakigori (shaved ice) shops and cafes, making it a wonderful place for a relaxing stroll.



Mt. Takao is a 599-meter high mountain on the west side of Tokyo. The area is also famous for its soba noodles and has several stellar restaurants both at the foot and the summit of the mountain.

Yakuoin Temple was established on the mountain over 1,000 years ago and is famous for Buddhist "shojin-ryori" style vegetarian cuisine (reservation required). A Fire-walking Festival is held every spring.

For those more interested in the science of Japan's nature, TAKAO 599 MUSEUM features the local flora and fauna and history, and hiking manners (free admission).







# **General Information for Tourists**



#### Climate

There are four distinct seasons. Spring –March to May– and autumn –September to November– are comfortable. However, there are many rainy days (rainy season) from mid-June to July.

In summer, it is hot during the day and humid at night. In winter, there are many clear days but it is often cold and dry.



#### Currency exchange, changing money

As of August 25, 2022, US\$1=¥136.48 Money can be exchanged at currency exchange counters located mainly at banks, post offices, hotels and airports.



#### **Postal services**

Mail can be sent from Japan to abroad at the post office. Postcards and letters can be left at the front desk of your hotel or dropped in a post box on the street or at a tourist site. All postcards cost ¥70. Letters vary from ¥90 to ¥230, depending on the destination.



#### **Smoking**

Although smoking is prohibited in most public facilities as a general rule, there are some facilities with smoking areas. Smoking is prohibited when specified in the streets of downtown areas, shops, restaurants, etc.



#### Currency

The yen ( $\pm$ ) is the currency of Japan. Bills come in denominations of  $\pm$ 10,000,  $\pm$ 5,000,  $\pm$ 2,000, and  $\pm$ 1,000. (Nowadays  $\pm$ 2,000 bills are rare)

Coins come in denominations of ¥500, ¥100, ¥50, ¥10. ¥5 and ¥1.



#### ATMs that accept overseas credit cards

Credit cards such as VISA, MasterCard, Diners Club, and American Express, as well as cash cards with logos issued by major banks of the world such as PLUS and Cirrus can be used with Japan Post, SEVEN BANK ATMs and AEON BANK located in Japan.

#### Voltage, power

The voltage in Japan is 100V. The frequency is 50/60Hz. A voltage transformer should be used with electronic items brought over from overseas. The double socket outlet is standard.



#### Tap water

Since Tokyo has an excellent water supply system, it is safe to drink straight tap water.



#### **Consumption tax**

#### Tax-free system

The requirement for tax exemption is the purchase of general items (electric appliances, clothing, accessories, etc.) worth over 5,000 yen at the same shop on the same day by the same person. For consumable items (food, drinks, medicine, cosmetics, etc.), tax exemption applies for purchases above 5,000 yen but below 500,000 yen at the same shop on the same day by the same person. For combination of general items and consumable items, tax-exemption applies under the same conditions as consumable items. Please see the Japan Tourism Agency website for details.

# Earthquake

When an earthquake occurs, be careful of falling objects and protect your head with an object at hand such as a bag. Don't rush outside in a panic.



#### When outdoors...

Once the earthquake has stopped, evacuate to an open space along with others, while paying attention to aftershocks, secondary disasters.





Tsunamis may occur not only along the coast, but also near rivers. Tsunami waves would be expected to strike land repeatedly. Do not go near waterfronts until the warning is lifted. Watch the actions of people around you and evacuate to higher grounds, or



#### When indoors...

tsunami shelters.

Once the earthquake has stopped, if emergency lights turn on, evacuate by walking along walls, and follow staff instructions.

Avoid evacuating by elevators that have not been declared safe.





# When safety is confirmed...



Paying attention to aftershocks and secondary disasters, return to your accommodation and get information through websites, TV, radio, etc.

# Typhoon / Flood

As the Meteorological Agency provides weather information for disaster prevention, including warnings, get information through websites, TV, radio, etc., and act appropriately.

#### 1. Advisory

The Japan Meteorological Agency will make an announcement when there is a risk of natural disasters due to heavy rain or strong winds.

Pay attention to evacuation procedures announced by local governments. In areas where rain/wind impact is expected, consider evacuating early if there are people who need support (handicapped or elderly people, infants, etc.).



#### 2. Warning

An announcement will be made when there is a risk of a serious disaster, and warnings will be issued in relevant areas.

Pay attention to evacuation information announced by your local government and swiftly evacuate accordingly.

#### 3. Emergency Warning

Emergency Warnings will be announced when there is a high risk of a major disaster which may occur once every few decades, and which far exceeds the standard warning level.

▶ Take appropriate actions in order to ensure safety, such as immediately relocating to a safe area.



#### Fire

If you are in a shop, evacuate the premises in accordance with the instructions from the staff. If you are in a hotel, make an emergency call to 119 and evacuate through the emergency exit.





Heat stroke is the general term for various symptoms caused by the body's inability to physically adapt to a hot and humid environment.

#### **Emergency Measures**

- Move to a cool place.
- Remove excess clothes and cool the body.
- Replenish water and salt levels.





For visitors to enjoy traveling in Tokyo while avoiding transmission risks, measures for avoiding infection or infecting others are important.

- Wear a face mask.
- Practice social distancing.
- Always remember to wash vour hands.
- Refrain from conversation in public transport.
- Enjoy the food and drink more with less talk.
- ▶Begin the day with a health check.






