

Welcome to North Mitaka

On the north side of Mitaka Station is a concentration of government offices to support residents' lives, and culture and sports facilities available to all, young and old alike. The area boasts many spots for relaxation and strolls, including Tokyo Municipal Musashino Chuo Park and Tamagawa Josui Canal. Here you can spend a leisurely time, relaxing as you please. The area is also known as the past home of Nakajima Aircraft Company Musashi Plant. Founded in 1917 by Chikuhei Nakajima, the company was one of the leading Japanese companies in the military aircraft industry at the time of the Pacific War. Between 1938 and 1945, the company produced engines in factories that spanned a vast area from the current Midoricho to Yahatacho in Musashino.

Best Spots



Musashino Chuo Park C-1

Musashino Chuo Park is located nearly in the center of Musashino. It was used as a war plant before and during the war, and then it became a residential area for a US base after the war. It is now a fine park as the result of residents' long-term demand being accepted. It is now a place for relaxation of all kinds, centered on its large open field and its sports grounds.



Tamagawa Josui Canal A-3 B-3 B-4 C-4 D-4 E-4

This aqueduct was built in 1653 over a length of 43 km from the modern Tokyo city of Hamura to Yotsuya in Shinjuku Ward, to supply drinking water throughout Edo (the old name of Tokyo). Even now, a portion of the aqueduct is operated by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Bureau of Waterworks as a waterworks facility. A pedestrian walkway runs alongside the aqueduct, letting people enjoy the murmur of running water as they enjoy strolls among green trees. (Please see the backside too.)



Cherry Tree Row (Chuo-dori) E-1 E-2 D-2

This outstanding row of cherry trees runs from near the intersection of Chuo-dori and Itsukaichi-kaido Avenue to the intersection at the entrance of Shiritsu Daiyon Junior High School, and along the street to the north of City Hall. When in full bloom, the trees appear to form a spectacular tunnel of blossoms. A Cherry Blossom Festival is held on the first Sunday of every April.



Green Park Path B-1 B-2

It is a promenade from the east side of Sakai Water Purification Plant, along the Tamagawa-josui, to the front entrance of Metropolitan Musashino Chuo Park. It was constructed using a discontinued shunting track which led to Nakajima Aircraft Company Musashi Plant before and during the war, and to Musashino Stadium after the war. People can enjoy strolling along the promenade, seeing seasonal changes of the nature.

NTT History Center of Technologies

This facility exhibits technical materials from the NTT Group, beginning with its start as Japan Telegraph and Telephone Public Corporation. The structure has two sections that trace history and explore technology, respectively. Visitors with advance reservations can take part in an observation course and a guided tour.

MUSASHINO ECO RESORT

There are study rooms for visitors to make objects using scrap wood or to learn environments.

Remains of the Nakajima Aircraft Company Musashi Plant Sports Ground

Currently used as a track and field ground, this location was originally the Nakajima Sports Ground, an employee welfare facility of Nakajima Aircraft Company.

Musashino Clean Center

In the reservation-free tour course, you can see the waste disposal process through the large glass.

Musashino Chuo Park

A camphor tree handed over by Nagasaki-shi and a flowering dogwood, a City Tree of Musashino-shi, are planted here.

Musashino-shi Heiwa no Ki

A camphor tree handed over by Nagasaki-shi and a flowering dogwood, a City Tree of Musashino-shi, are planted here.

Former Anti-Aircraft Gun Position in Sekimae

Six anti-aircraft cannon were positioned near here in a half circle, in readiness for aerial bombing by the U.S. military.

Ginnan Bridge

(Historic remains of the abutment of the bridge for a shunting line to Nakajima Aircraft Company Musashi Plant) Due to the construction of a metropolitan road, a pedestrian bridge was newly built over Tamagawa-josui. Under the bridge there still remains a part of abutment for the shunting line.

Flyover (Mitaka Flyover Bridge)

It was built in 1929 and retains its original form. Osamu Dazai often visited, and the photograph standing on the foot of the bridge remains.

World's Federal Peace Statue

Inside the Mitaka Station North Exit rotary

This work is by sculptor Seizo Kikumura, famed for his Peace Statue at Nagasaki Peace Park. The world's Federal Peace Statue was erected to commemorate 10 years since the World's Federal Cities Declaration of Musashino in 1969.

Kunikida Doppo Monument

Next to the Mitaka Station North Exit Police Box

On the surface of the monument, it is inscribed with a brush by Sanetsugu Mushonokoji, saying "Sanjin ni yu souno (There is freedom in the forest.)" And the Doppo's relief is attached.

Welcome to Musashisakai

With the completion of a project for raised intersections at railway crossings, the area around the newly connected north and south areas of the station is undergoing development and has greatly changed. The impact of multiple universities and cultural facilities is spurring the location's evolution into an area for learning, where cultural and academic activities flourish in many domains. The surrounding residential neighborhoods have expanded, bordering Koganei Park to the west.

Best Spots and Public Facilities



Agriculture Fureai Park C-1
This new, urban-style park brings agriculture into a park space. Local citizens conduct hands-on agricultural experiences and events in the park, which also features a relocated and restored nagayamom building thought to date back to the late Edo Period.



Furuse Park A-2
This atmospheric Japanese-style park is thickly covered with pine and cherry trees around its pond. Visitors can enjoy Shoroon, an authentic tearoom reconstructed from the summer home of the Furuse family built at the start of the Showa Era. The room is used now for sado (tea ceremony), kado (flower arrangement), kukai (haiku poetry gatherings), and more.



Kizuki Taisha Shrine E-4
In the early Edo period, Matsudaira Naomasa, who maintained a daimyo summer residence on the site, built Kizuki-Taisha Shrine (currently Izumo-Taisha Shrine). Dedicated to the gods Daikokuken and Ebisu, this is a shrine of good fortune and matchmaking. And the Fujizuka (Miniature Mt. Fuji) built in the precincts of the shrine is the second highest in Tama region.



Doppo-no-Mori Forest (Sakaisanya Green Area) C-1 C-2
This park offers one of the few remaining scenes of thick coppices within the city. With its connections to the novel Musashino by Meiji Period literary master Doppo Kunikida, the southern half of the park is known to locals as "Doppo-no-Mori" (Doppo Forest).



Kannon-in Temple D-3
Matsudaira Naomasa built this temple to Kannon at his daimyo summer residence. It later became a temple of the Soto sect. Visitors can experience Zen meditation at the temple.



Musashino Swing Hall D-3
This concert hall is fully soundproofed by a dual structure. The multi-purpose room is perfect for dances and reception. Conference rooms that can be used as exhibition spaces are also available.



Musashino Furusato History Museum A-3
This museum features an exhibition room where visitors can learn about the history of Musashino, as well as exhibit rooms for themed exhibits, a "citizens' space" which can be used for historic and cultural educational activities, and collection rooms for the storage and preservation of historic official documents, folk materials, and other valuable items.

Musashino Place D-3
This multi-functional facility houses a library, a cafe, and functions to support lifelong learning, citizens' activities, and youth activities. In 2016, it received an award from the Architectural Institute of Japan.
Hours: 9:30-22:00 Closed on Wednesdays, holidays, year-end/New Year holidays, and other designated days



Wildlife Museum E-3
affiliated (connected) with Nippon Veterinary and Life Science University
In the bldg. 1, one of the national tangible cultural assets, you can see exhibitions on the University's history and on wild animals in Japan, as well as the periodical programs.
*Due to the construction, the building is closed now, and is scheduled to reopen in August 2022.

Senkawa Aqueduct
This aqueduct was opened in 1696 primarily to divert water from the Tamagawa Josui Canal to locations including Koshikawa Palace, Yushima Seido, Tozean Kan'e-ji Temple, and Asakusa Palace.

Monument to Restoration of Clear Streams
The Tamagawa Josui Canal ceased to carry water in 1965, and remained dried up for some time thereafter. Through a Tokyo Metropolitan Government project to restore clear streams, the flow of water was restored to the Tamagawa Josui Canal in 1986 and to the Senkawa Aqueduct in 1989.

Kunikida Doppo Literature Monument
This monument is inscribed with a passage from the novel "Musashino" by Doppo Kunikida, known as a forerunner of literary naturalism.

Ruins of the Shinagawa Waterway Inlet
This waterway was opened in 1669 as an agricultural waterway within the Shinagawa area. It continued to serve the district for 200 years.

Sakai Water Purification Plant
It is a water purification plant built in 1924 to purify water from Murayama and Yamaguchi Reservoirs. It is one of the largest plants in Japan which uses slow filtration system.

Tamagawa Josui Canal
Running from Hamura Inokubo to Yosoyu Okido, this naturally flowing waterway is said to have been constructed in only eight months in 1653. In 2003, it was designated as a national historic city engineering facility/structure (with historic value for aiding the development of Edo and Tokyo).

Sakai-Ohashi Bridge
This is one of the first bridges built within the area of modern Musashino after the Tamagawa Josui Canal was completed in 1654.

Motomura Park
It is a trace of a shunting track which was used to transport materials and/or sand for filtration for the construction and the maintenance of Sakai Water Purification Plant.

nonowa Walk
This walking space under an elevated bridge runs from Musashisakai Station toward Tachikawa. A variety of shops are lined up here.
