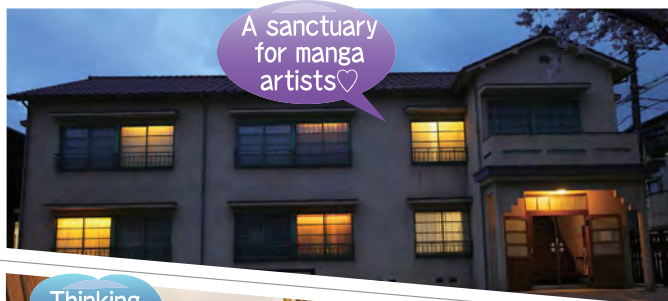

What is the Tokiwaso Manga Museum?

The former Tokiwaso apartment building was completed on December 6, 1952, at the address 5-2253 Shiinamachi in Toshima City. Although it was demolished in December 1982, thanks to the help of many supporters, it was reconstructed as a manga museum. With cooperation from manga and anime lovers, the museum is the site of planned exhibitions and other events as a hub to share manga and anime culture and pass it down to future generations.

Reproduction

The exterior and interior faithfully recreate how Tokiwaso looked when manga artists worked hard together and learned from each other there. You can get a glimpse at the lifestyles of manga artists in the 1950s and '60s.

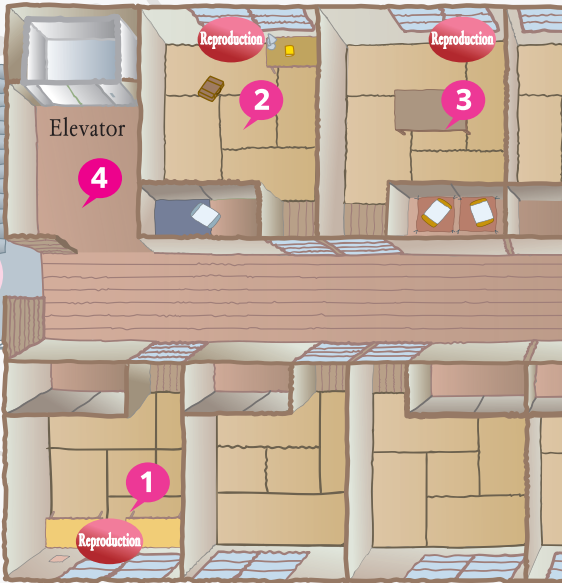

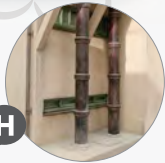

■ Manga Lounge: This space displays manga and books connected to Tokiwaso.

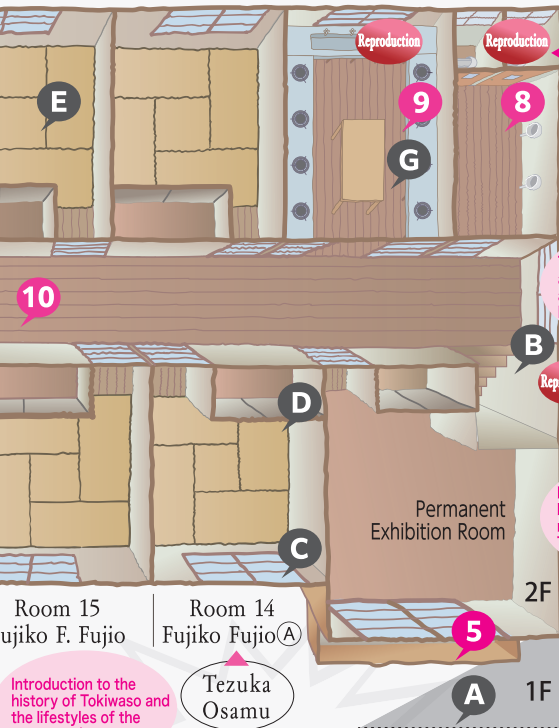
Wooden apartment building in real life!!

■ Planned Exhibition Room: Exhibitions and events related to manga and anime are held here.

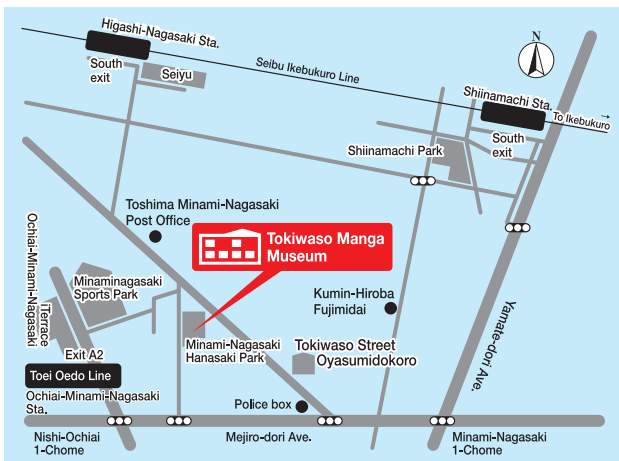
Visitors' Guide

- Operating Hours : 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. (Last admission : 5:30 p.m.)
- Closed : Mondays (or the next non-holiday if Monday is a national holiday), year-end and New Year holidays, exhibit-changing periods, etc.
- Admission Fee : Admission fee required to enter all areas of the Museum during special planned exhibitions (Please check the Museum's website for details.)
- Visitor Rules
 - Visitors must remove their shoes before entering the Museum. As entering barefoot is not permitted, please come wearing socks or bring them with you.
 - Please do not bring food, beverages, or fresh flowers inside the Museum.
 - Pencils are the only writing implements that may be used inside the Museum.
 - Unauthorized posting, distribution, or display of advertisements and sales are not permitted inside the Museum or on the Museum premises.
 - For other information, please refer to "Visitors' Guide" on the Museum's website.
- Parking Lot / Bicycle Parking
 - Please contact the Museum in advance to use the handicapped parking lot (two spaces).
 - There is no general visitors' parking lot. Please use public transportation.

Access

Easily accessible! Just 1 station from Ikebukuro Station and 6 stations (approx. 15 min.) from Shinjuku Station on the Oedo Line

5-min. walk from Ochiai-minami-nagasaki Station (Toei Oedo Line)
10-min. walk from Higashi-Nagasaki Station and 15-min. walk from Shiinamachi Station (Seibu-Ikebukuro Line)
