Pickup and drop-off at a specified location! Tour Tokyo in comfort

Tokyo sightseeing taxis are chartered taxis that will pick you up and drop you off at the location of your choice. A certified Tokyo sightseeing taxi driver will chauffeur you around to sightseeing places in Tokyo while providing guidance that goes above and beyond. Drivers include "Tokyo Metropolitan Government Licensed Guide" who are accredited according to the Licenced Guide Interpreters Act. Tourist information can also be provided in English.



How to use this pamphlet

The recommended routes shown in this pamphlet may not be offered by the taxi company you engage. Please contact the taxi company for more information.



The information provided for each facility is accurate as of September 2022.

The times and fees required are approximations calculated for guided sightseeing in Japanese using a sedan-type taxi transporting 4 people.

The hotels for departure and arrival (pickup and drop-off) are assumed to be in central areas such as Chiyoda, Chuo, Minato, Shinjuku, Taito, and Shibuya cities.





Points to note when using a Tokyo sightseeing taxi

- (1) A reservation is required. Please contact the taxi company for more information.
- (2) You are free to design a route if the pickup and drop-off sites are in the 23 wards or Tama area, including usage times, pickup/drop-off sites, and sightseeing spots.
- (3) Fares differ according to usage times and the taxi company. Be sure to check with the taxi company as fares can differ depending on factors such as the day's traffic conditions and the specified driver.
- (4) Usage time includes activities such as time spent shopping and eating meals.
- (5) You are responsible for fees incurred on the day of sightseeing, such as for parking, facility entrance fees (including the driver's), and expressway tolls.
- (6) Depending on the facility, the driver may not be able to accompany you inside.
- (7) Some facilities require you to make reservations yourself, so please be sure to check with the taxi company.
- (8) Depending on the taxi company, there may be drivers who can speak English, so please check the (English) websites of the companies shown on page 27.


Map of recommended routes

Visitors from Japan and abroad come to Asakusa. Sensoji Temple is the oldest temple in the city with a history spanning over 1,400 years. Enjoy shopping at Nakamise, a shopping street of approximately 90 shops along the passageway from Kaminarimon Gate that includes long-established shops in business since the Edo period.

Tokyo Station Marunouchi Building

Though daylight nicely shows off the attractive red bricks, the nighttime view is recommended when the building is illuminated to create a romantic visage. This is a classic daimyo's garden from the Edo period. In addition to Shioiri-no-ike Pond that is filled with water drawn from the sea, there are two duck hunting sites. The several teahouses that once existed have been reconstructed and restored, and you can enjoy matcha tea at Nakajima-no-ochaya Teahouse located in the middle of Shioiri-no-ike Pond.



State Guest House Akasaka Palace

Built in 1909, this is the only Imperial building constructed in the neo-Baroque style in Japan. It's a culmination of everything the Japanese architectural, art, and craft industries had to offer at that time. The main building and garden stand as they were originally constructed and can be visited without an appointment.

Rainbow Bridge

This 798-meter suspension bridge is a symbol of Tokyo Port that connects the city center with the seaside sub-metropolitan center. The top of the bridge offers a sweeping view of Tokyo Bay and the buildings, so soak up the view of Tokyo from the taxi window from sunset to nighttime. You can also enjoy the bridge lit up at night.



Entakuzan Houkouji Temple

This famous temple in Nishitama was built in 1478. Rokuya Daibutsu is the second largest statue of Buddha in Japan. It was completed in 2018 and stands 12 meters high. The temple grounds are enveloped in nature, and flowers and plants decorate the area around the statue in each of the four seasons.
