

Sightseeing Spots along the Toden Arakawa Line and the Nippori-Toneri Liner (Ogu & Nippori)

① Toden Arakawa Line Depot

MAP A-2 (6-33 Nishi-Ogu)

The Toden Arakawa Line, operating between Minowabashi Station and Waseda Station, uses 5 different models, including the new 8900 model, and has two old models on display at the Toden Omotebashi. They will also be holding events "Street Car Day" and "October 1" to commemorate "Arakawa Line Day".

② Arakawa Yuen Brick Wall

MAP B-2 (Vicinity of 6-20-31 Nishi-Ogu)

In the early Meiji Period, brick factories were lined up in this area for bricks and concrete, ship transportation etc. Following this, in 1922, the Arakawa Amusement Park was opened on this site, and bricks from the brick factories were used to build the fence around the Amusement Park.

③ Arakawa Yuen Amusement Park

MAP B-1 (6-25-11 Nishi-Ogu)

This is the only water amusement park in Tokyo, and it was reopened after renovating in 2022. A wide range of people can enjoy the water amusement park. It has a lot of water slides, and Animal Square, which has a lot of animals. Admission fee: Adults 800 yen, Elementary school students 200 yen. Opening hours: 9AM-5PM (until 4PM on days when the park is open at night). Closed on Tuesdays and other days depending on circumstances. *For details, please see the official homepage. ④ Waterbus Landing and Glockenspiel

MAP B-1 (6-35 Nishi-Ogu)

Near the Arakawa Yuen Amusement Park lies the waterbus station for Sumidagawa River's Tokyo Mizube Line. (Special operating hours on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays). On the nearby callings, it's a glockenspiel with an inscription from 1643, a Koshin tower, and other stone structures built in the Edo Period. Temple festivals are held on "Days with 25", on the 12th, 12th and 22nd of each month, believing this to be good for long life and child rearing, and an Obon memorial service is held every year on July 12 by priests.

⑤ Enmei Kosodate Jizozon

MAP B-2 (6-32 Nishi-Ogu)

Contains stone structures beginning with two Himachikyo towers with inscriptions from 1669 and 1705, a Jizozon with an inscription from 1643, a Koshin tower, and other stone structures built in the Edo Period. Temple festivals are held on "Days with 25", on the 12th, 12th and 22nd of each month, believing this to be good for long life and child rearing, and an Obon memorial service is held every year on July 12 by priests.

Sightseeing Spots along the Toden Arakawa Line (Arakawa & Machiya)

① Ogunohara Park

MAP E-2 (7-1 Higashi-Ogu)

Habitat to dragonflies and wild birds, this environment in its natural state also grows abundant mid-habitat plants such as reeds around its pond, which is commonly known as Tonbo-like Pond. The pond, which is adjacent to a super embankment overlooking the Sumidagawa River, is also a famous location for viewing weeping cherry blossom trees. The "Shizurekura (Weeping Cherry Blossom Festival)" is held every year in early April.

② Tropland Arakawa Store

MAP F-2 (3-22-11 Machiya)

This bright store with more than 400 water tanks and a variety of tropical fish, goldfish, freshwater fish and ornamental ponds, etc. is like a small aquarium. Certified as an Arakawa Kosodate Support Store, the store holds events for children such as goldfish scooping etc. Closed: Tuesdays. Inquiries: 03-3892-9438

③ Jigenji Temple

MAP E-3 (2-20-12 Machiya)

Local villagers believed the temple would heal eye diseases and help mothers produce a good supply of breast milk. The grounds hold two stone pagodas dated 1663 and 1678 that are dedicated to the goddess Nyorin Kannon, as well as a number of other stone works.

④ Haranari Jinja Shrine

MAP E-3 (2-8-7 Machiya)

This shrine is called Haru Ina Shrine, and it was established from ancient times. Based on the legend, it is said that the shrine was established before the time. Various theories exist that when Inaga was entered in 1755, the shrine was moved to the Machiya area and dedicated to the shrine. At the Minami-Senju Senryo Jinja Shrine Festival, the shrine area is a Kazabiki-bonpo (a red paper streamer) parade (held during this festival) every three years at the Gogyo Festival (held during Gogyo Festival).

Toden Arakawa Line

A street car which connects the 12-20-12 (10 stops) between Minowabashi (Arakawa-kai) and Waseda (Shinjuku-kai) in about 60 minutes. Senju-hashido-chō
