THE HOTEL

Superbly situated opposite the Imperial Palace in the prestigious financial district of Marunouchi, The Peninsula Tokyo's grand, free-standing 24-story tower offers easy access to the best the city has to offer: Hibiya Park, museums, restaurants, and the world-class shopping of Naka Dori Avenue and Ginza are all just a short walk away. The hotel is directly connected to Hibiya station which

has access to four major train lines and is a 10-minute taxi ride from Tokyo Station, making it the most accessible luxury hotel to explore the city.

ACCOMMODATION

The Peninsula Tokyo's 302 spacious, elegantly appointed guest rooms include 47 suites, as well as two palatial, ultra-luxurious suites, the 298-square-meter (3,207-square-foot) Hibiya Suite and the

347-square-meter (3,735-square-foot) Peninsula Suite, both of which have unparalleled Imperial Palace views and are ideal venues for hosting private receptions. The Peninsula Suite's contemporary dining room can seat 12, and guests can enjoy the ultimate Japanese experience with a private Tea Ceremony conducted in their suite.

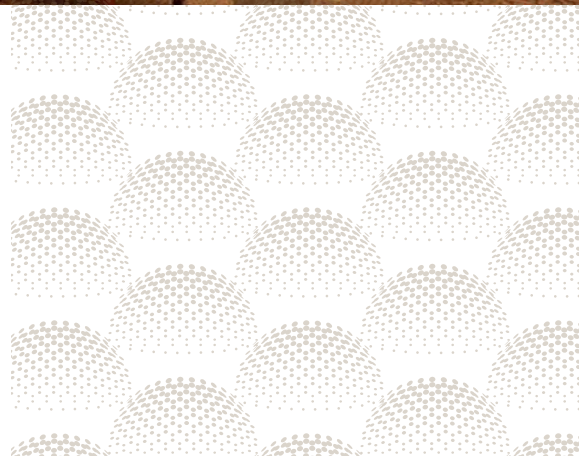
VENUES

The Seven Seas Pacific Aviation Lounge

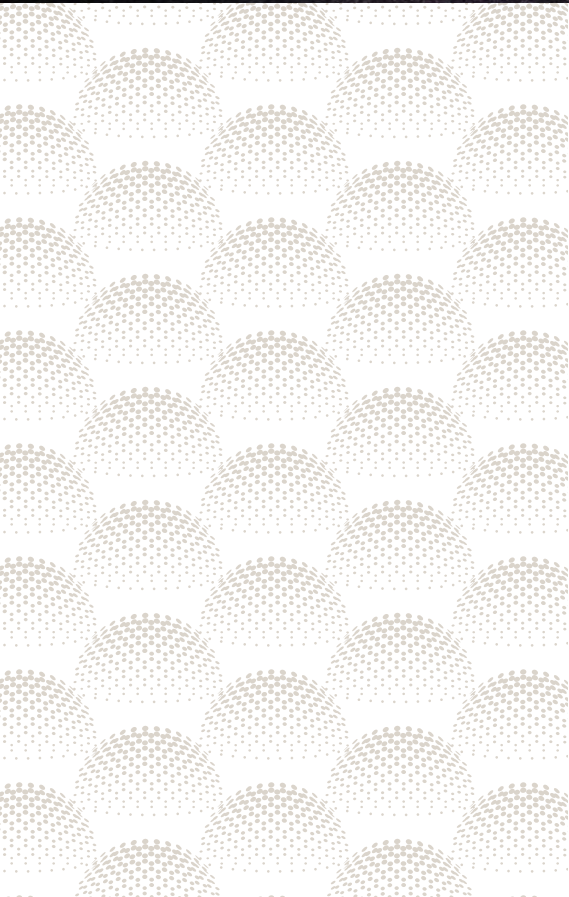
Remarkable • Distinguished

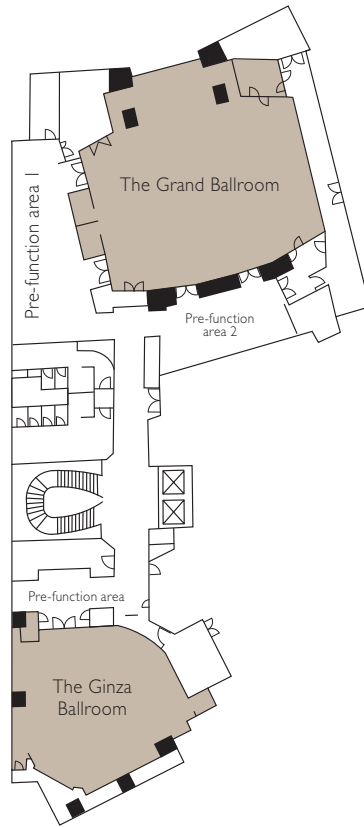

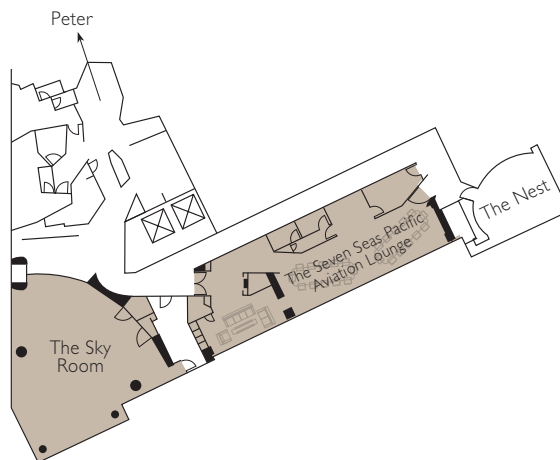

- *Private Sake Brewery Tours*
Guests who are interested in learning about Japan's signature beverage can do so deliciously with a customized visit to the Izumibashi Shuzo sake brewery, one of the country's most venerable sake producers. Tours include luxury round-trip transportation via The Peninsula's fleet of BMW or van.
- *Furin Making: Japanese Wind Chimes*
Glass wind chimes brightly painted with colorful motifs are popular summer decorations in Japan. Known as furin, they are hung from porch eaves or in windows, where their clear, light tones draw our attention to cooling breezes. Participants in this program will visit Shinhohara Furin Honpo, a family-run business founded in 1915, and one of the few remaining studios in the country

where these chimes are still fashioned by hand. Each guest will craft his or her own furin by blowing the glass and painting the bell as a keepsake gift of the experience.
