

Chiyoda City continues to be the center of Tokyo from the Edo era with the Imperial Palace, government agencies and office distrect located here. The whole city has earthquake measureds in place for buildings, therefore if you are indoors, please remain

calm and remain inside even if an earthquake occurs. However, if you sense danger or if you are outdoors, please go to the nearest "evacation center" being careful of things dropping

An earthquake is a very scary disaster that occurs by the strong energy of the earth but by taking appropriate actions and remaining calm you can minimize the danger.

In order to do that, let's acquire knowledge and prepare

Summary of Tables explaining the JMA Seismic Intensity Scale

Seismic intensity O	Imperceptible to people,
Seismic intensity 1	Felt slightly by some people in a room.
Seismic intensity 2	Felt by many people in a room.
Seismic intensity 3	Felt by most people in buildings.
Seismic intensity 4	Most people are startled. Sleeping people wake up. Hanging objects such as lamps swing significantly. Unstable ornaments may fall.
Seismic intensity 5 Lower	People are frightened and feel the need to hold onto something stable Many People are frightened and items on bookshelves may fall.
Seismic intensity 5 Upper	People find it difficult to walk without holding onto something stable. Unreinforced concrete-block walls may collapse.
Seismic intensity 6 Lower	It is difficult to remain standing. In wooden houses with low earthquake resistance, buildings may lean.

Indoors

If there is a table, go under it.

- If you are on an elevator, get off at the floor it stops.
- Even if it stops shaking, do not use elevators or escalators.
- During concerts or theatrical play. please hide yourself between the seats.
- Don't move about with no reason and calmly follow the instructions of the shop staff and clerks.



Outdoors

- Please protect yourself by putting a bag or knapsack over your head.
- Watch out for falling objects from above such as glass windows, signboards and brick walls and vending machines falling.
- Do not use cars when evacuating as roads can get congested and emergency vehicles will not be able to go
- If on a train or bus, please grab the hand rail or strap.
- If the train stops please follow the instructions of the station staff.





Evacuation center

Even in a safe indoor situation, if you sense danger the "evacuation center" is the place to evacuate when you are outdoors. In Chiyoda City, the Kokyo-gaien National Garden, the East Gardens of the Imperial Palace, Soto-bori Park, Kitanomaru Garden, Hibiya Park and Sanada-bori Playground are designated evacuation centers (please refer to the map at the back).

Evacuation area in times of disaster is only a temporary evacuation place to ensure your safety immediately after a disaster. In times of disaster, information such as facilities accepting those having difficulty going back home and public transportation service information are given by a speaker using a wireless disaster prevention system.



Information useful for foreign disaster victims visiting Japan

Stay calm and quiet and review the situation.

- If you cannot connect to the internet, you can obtain disaster information through foreign language broadcast, if you have a portable radio.
- Please carry with you simple food such as chocolates and caramels as food to eat in an emergency.

Decide on contacting methods and a meeting place with

- your family and friends. Confirm the well being of your family and friends and
- contact your family overseas of your own well being. It is convenient if you prepare yourself for the
- weather of each season (e.g.. Raincoat, portable body warmer, towel).
- When evacuating, talk to each other and help each other out.

When a big earthquake occurs, many people will be using fixed phones as well as mobile phones and calls will be regulated. In such a situation, the way to make a call is by using a public phone. You can make international





Iidabashi / Kudan / Ichigaya

1 Tokyo Daijingu Shrine

Constructed in 1880 as a far away place of worship of Ise-Jingu Shrine in Tokyo. Called "Ise sama of Tokyo". A shrine that founded and spread Shinto wedding. The three creator gods of marriage ties are worshipped here



2 Yasukuni-jinja Shrine

Started as Tokyo Shokonsha built in 1869. War dead after the Meiji restoration are enshrine here. There is a large torii of 25m in height and a museum Yushukan in the compounds. It is famous for its cherry blossoms in spring time and gingko in autumn. Many paper lanterns



3 Nippon Budokan

Constructed as the Judo competition venue for the Tokyo Olympics in 1964. Located inside Kitanomaru Garden and used as a martial arts training ground and competition venue. Furthermore it is widely used for such events as concerts, university entrance ceremomies and graduation ceremonies.




4 Kitanomaru Garden MAP E-3

Former Edo castle, Kitanomaru. A forest park with a grass open space and a pond in the middle. It is famous for its cherry blossoms in spring time and red leaves in autumn. Inside the park there is a Shimizu-mon gate, a Tayasu-mon gate, a Science Museum, the National Museum of Modern Art and the National Archives of Japan. The crafts building of the



5 Chidori-ga-fuchi Moat

A moat built along Kitanomaru Garden from Yasukuni-dori Ave. The pathway is one of the famous spots to view cherry blossoms. During early April, cherry blossoms are illuminated at night. You can enjoy the cherry blossoms while riding a boat. In summer "Noryo no Yube" (hanging lanterns are lit and put on the water where they remain afloat) is held.




Ochanomizu / Jimbocho

It is impossible to move without crawling.

This is a reinforced concrete arch bridge built over Kanda river in 1927 as one of the reconstruction bridges of the Great Kanto Earthquake. Its name was chosen through naming campaign open to the public as a

Ochanomizu Musical Instrument Shop District MAP F-2

Along Meidai-dori street, from Ochanomizu station to Surugadaishita intersection, many musical instrument stores can be found. Stores selling guitars to other various instruments line up the street. Many universities exist in this neighborhood hence this town is full of students. There are many regular musi cal events being held.

8 Nikolai-do

Constructed in 1891. It was damaged in the Great Kanto Earthquake and restored i 1929. It is a 35m high, Byzantine style archi-Cathedral in Tokyo". It is a cathedral of the Orthodox Church and a national important cultural property. Its feature is its verdigris colored dome roof. Church viewing is



Jimbocho Book Town and Popular Gourmet

World's number one book district. It began by old bookshops, one after another, opening shop in this student district. Along Yasukuni-dori Ave. at its center, many old and new bookshops popped up. In autumn, Kanda old book festival and Jimbocho book festival are held. There are many curry restaurants and coffee shops in this neighborhood



(I) Kanda Sports Goods District

Along Yasukuni-dori Ave., from Kanda-Ogawamachi to Suruadaishita, many sports stores can be found. Especially, specialty stores including ski and snowboard shops are plenty. In autumn, Kanda Sports Festival, Kanda Curry Grand Prix and in winter, Kanda-Ogawamachi Snowman Fair are held.



Akihabara / Kanda

1 3331 Arts Chiyoda

An art center using the former Rensei Junior High School. There is an art gallery where exhibitions are held and there are cafes as well and workshops and lectures are held 😘 regularly. This is a base for cultural and art 🌆 🧗



Kanda Myojin Shrine

Established in 730. The shrine was relocated

to its present location in 1616 and became guardian of the whole of Edo. Onamuchinomikoto. Sukunahikonanomikoto and Tairanomasakado are enshrined together. Kanda 🎚 restival is one of the three biggest festivals of Edo and once every two years, Shinko festival and Mikoshi (portable shrine) entrance are held. There are stores selling sweet sake outside the shrine gate.



Akihabara Electric Town

After the war, stallholders of wireless and 🌉🕵 radio parts gathered here. Shops selling elec trical products lined up the streets and developed into a world renowned electric town. . There are many stores specializing in audio 🌌 and PC products. In recent years, re-development around the station has taken place and



14 Akihabara Pop Cultural Town

An information dissemination base for pop culture such as comics, animation and figurines. It is attracting world-wide attention and there are many tourists from overseas. There are many hobby shops including games. The main street becomes a pedestrian only street every Sunday.



Awajicho-Sudacho Old Shop District

This was an important transportation hub in 🖔 the Edo era. Near the Kanda-Sudacho intersection, the area is dotted with historical buildings of well-established restaurants which show glimpses of the past. You can enjoy typical Japanese dishes such as soba. There is mAAch ecute KANDA MANSEIBASHI 🌆 using bricks from the neighboring old 🚪 Manseibashi station.



Kojimachi / Hanzo-mon / Nagatacho The Imperial Palace 6 Bancho Bunjin-dori Street

The street from Kojimachi-dori street to Otsu ma-dori street is known as Bancho-Bunjin-dori street. Many authors and literary scholars from Meiji to Showa era such as Toson Shimazaki, Kyoka Izumi, Takeo Arishima and Akiko/Tekkan Yosano used to live

around Bancho/Kojimachi area. You can find nformation plates around the area. **(7)** Shimizudani Park

In the Edo era, there used to be a mansion belonging to the Kii Tokugawa household and the Ii household. Inside the park, there is

a memorial of Sir Toshimichi Okubo, the chief 🗾 of internal affairs who was assassinated near this park in 1878. In the neighboring Hotel New Otani, there is a Japanese Garden which is one of the most charming gardens in

(B) National Theatre

At the large/small theatre, traditional Japanese performance arts are performed ncluding Kabuki, Bunraku, Buyo, Hogaku, fo entertainment, Shomyo and Gagaku. At the National Engei Hall, popular entertainment such as Rakugo and Kodan are performed. The front garden is well known for its beautiful cherry blossoms and rare varieties are planted



(1) National Diet Bldg. The center of Japanese politics. Construction

completed in 1936. Facing the building, to the left is the House of Representatives and to the right is the House of Councillors. Tours of both are available. In the adjoining front garden of the parliament is the Kensei Kinenkan memorial hall and you can enjoy the natural beauty of cherry blossoms and flowering



100 Hie-jinja Shrine When Dokan Ota was building the Edo

castle, this shrine was transferred to this location. Famous for its divine favor of warding off evil, safe birth and visit by children aged 7, 5 and 3 (Japanese ritual). Sanno torii and statue of a monkey couple are a must see. Sanno festival called Tenka festival is held and at the Shinko festival held every other year, a magnificent dynasty picture scroll ignites the urban center.

The East Gardens of the Imperial Palace MAP F-5

Part of the inner, outer citadel and outermost region of the former Edo castle. At the inner citadel remains, you can see the stone walls of the donjon and the Fujimi watchtower. In the outer citadel garden and its thicket, various plants can be observed throughout the season. It is open to the public and you can enter from Ote-mon gate, Hirakawa-mon gate and Kitahanebashi-mon gate.



Wadakura Fountain Park

Built in 1961 to commemorate the wedding of the Emperor. There is a large fountain that reaches a height of 8.5 meters. It was upgraded upon the marriage of the Crown Prince in 1995. There are running water facility and monuments and at night the fountain is lit u

⚠ Kokyo-gaien National Garden

One of the best people's park in Japan. There is a large open space with grass and black oines planted and there are historical architectures such as a moat leaving traces of the Edo castle of old and a castle gate. There is a statue of Masashige Kusunoki which is one of the three famous bronze statues in Tokyo and there are bus parking areas, restaurants and shops nearby.



24 Nijubashi Bridge

The bridge in front is the "Seimon-ishibashi bridge" and the bridge at the back is the "Sei mon-tetsubashi bridge". It is called Niju combining both bridges but to be exact, it refers to the bridge at the back. In the Edo era it was a dual structure bridge. It is only used for formal palace occasions such as the palace visit by the general public in the New Year.

mportant cultural property designated by the country. Officially called "Kyu Edo-jogai Sakurada-mon". It is a square shaped castle gate and it was reconstructed in 1636, later damaged in the 1923 Great kanto Earthguake and repaired. In 1860, "The accident outside Sakurada-mon gate" occurred in which chief minister, Naosuke li was attacked.



Tokyo Station / Hibiya

Gyoko-dori Avenue

This is a street of approximately 74 meters in width that runs from Tokyo station to Uchibori-dori street in front of the imperial palace. There are ginkgo row of trees famous for its vellow leaves and on both sides there are buildings with Marunouchi Bldg. on the right and Shin-Marunouchi Bldg. on the left. State carriages pass through this street on imperial

Tokyo Station

Built in 1914, this is a terminal station and a gateway to Tokyo. Restoration work took place and in 2012 it was restored back to its ormer Marunouchi station building. Inside the station building there is a hotel and a station gallery. There are plenty of shops and



23 Marunouchi Naka-dori Street

This is a street connecting Yurakucho and Otemachi. Brand shops, restaurants and cafes line up this street which is in an office district. The street is paved with stones and on both sides of the street, there are roadside trees and objects of art. There are events held for every season and in winter a



29 Cultural institution around Marunouchi

Within walking distance from Tokyo station, there are many art and cultural facilities such as the Mitsubishi Ichigokan Museum, Idemitsu Museum of Arts and Mitsuo Aida Museum. Around Yurakucho station, there is the Tokyo International Forum and many other theaters and cinemas.



(3) Hibiya Park

Opened in 1903 as Japan's first modern/western city park. Colorful, seasonal flowers bloom all year round in the Flowerbeds. Inside the park there are two open-air concert hall, the Hibiya public hall and the Hibiya library & museum. Big bon dance festival and various events are held centered
